Buffaloes slip past Cowboys 10-7

The Goodland Star-News At the end of four quarters, the much anticipated game between the Goodland Cowboys and the Atwood Buffaloes was tied at seven, but in the end it was the Buffaloes who got to tally a win, 10-7.

Goodland got on the scoreboard first halfway through the first quarter scoring on a 24-yard run three plays after intercepting an Atwood pass. The Buffaloes tied the score in the second quarter on a short run that capped a 60-yard drive. Both teams went scoreless in the second half.

The Cowboys got the first possession in overtime but fumbled the ball away on their second play. Playing conservative, Atwood ran three plays up the middle to set up the winning field goal.

"We played pretty well on defense most of the night," Head Coach Tony Diehl said, "but the critical mistake we made was not running our fullback enough. Atwood's ability to chew up the clock caused us to be impatient with our offense.'

Atwood is now 4-0 for the season and in the Northwest Kansas League, while Goodland drops to 3-1 overall, 2-1 in the league.

The Cowboys went on offense first, deep in their own territory, but Atwood's defense held Goodland to a "three-and-out" series and forced a punt

Starting from their own 48 yard line, the Buffaloes opened their first offensive drive with a 14-yard pass play for a first-down. The Cowboy defense stiffened and with thirddown and 10 yards to go, Goodland senior linebacker Jordan Bedore intercepted a pass by Atwood quarterback Curtis Snodgress.

Bedore returned the interception 22 yards to the Buffalo 39. Two rushing plays later the Cowboys had a first-and-10 on the Atwood 26. After two short runs, they were third and eight, and senior quarterback Jared Doke ran 24 yards off left tackle for a touchdown.

Senior place-kicker Ian Scherling kicked the extra point, and with 6 minutes 51 seconds left in the first quarter Goodland was leading 7-0.

The Buffaloes returned the kickoff to their own 33, where they began a sustained drive to the Cowboy 39 before it stalled. Buffaloes drove 31 yards to the Cowboy 34. Then on fourth-andthree, Atwood's quarterback atbroken up by Goodland junior defensive back Lane Winter.

The Cowboy's began the last drive of the first half from their own 27 and were able to move the ball into Atwood territory close enough for Scherling to attempt a 31-yard field goal. However, as time ran out, the kick fell short.

The Buffaloes returned the second-half kickoff to their own 35 and using a balanced attack, drove to the Cowboys' 41 before the drive stalled. Horinek then kicked Atwood's only punt of the game 30 yards, pinning Goodland on its own

The Cowboys were able to drive the ball out to their own 29 before being forced to punt.

After returning the punt to its own 32-yard line, Atwood ran one play, losing a yard, the third quarter ended. The Buffaloes then sus-Goodland 37, and the Cowboys

goal to give Atwood the win 10-7. Atwood gained 234 total yards, 189 on the ground and 45 through the air, compared to Goodland's 120, 105 rushing and 15 passing. The Buffaloes were successful on 7 of 19 third-downs and 5 of 8 fourthdown conversion attempts. The Cowboys converted just one of 7

Doke led Goodland's rushers with 44 yards on 10 carries. Sophomore Bobby Miller gained 37 yards on 10 carries and Bedore added 24 on three carries.
