# Cowboys win at Oberlin, Cowgirls finish second

"I was thrilled with the performance of everyone," said Coach Don Smith. "They all did very well, and all brought home a medal."

This was the team's first meet win in several years, Smith said, and that it was thrilling for him, the members and the parents who traveled to Oberlin.

Kalie Smith won the girls race with her best time of 12:51. Smith said there were 80-plus runners in the race.

"She won it in the last 300 yards," Coach Smith said. "She was third at that point, but caught the other two girls in the last few yards.

"Speedy Aguilar had a very close finish, and was two seconds behind the winner from Cambridge, Neb. It was one of his best races, but I know he thinks he could have won

Smith said he was proud of the girls team effort, and that with the girls from Sharon Springs they have been working together and getting their times closer together.

"It is a shame that we only have team," he said. "They have been doing well, and then when we get to the end of the season, we have to from a smaller school."

Tiffany Thomas finished 10th with a time of 13:27, and received a medal. Whitney Dautel was 12th with a time of 13:28, and was just out of medaling.

"It was truly a team effort," Smith said, "and there was wonderful support from everyone."

"It was a great effort, and they all did well," he said. "I was really happy with James Cearley's race. It was his best all time and his finish really helped the team."
