Cowgirl volleyball winning streak at 11

The Goodland Star-News The Cowgirl volleyball team continued its winning ways Tuesday afternoon at Max Jones Fieldhouse, winning all three of its matches in straight sets.

The three victories improved Goodland's record to 16-2 and stretched its winning streak to 11 matches. A solid defense and a overwhelming offense, including a devastating serving attack, combined to dominate the Cowgirls' opponents for five of the six games they played.

"We were excited with our play," said Coach Jerry McKee. "The overall play was good, and so was the competition level. We need matches like those Tuesday night to make us raise our level of play."

In their first match, the Cowgirls defeated the Jackrabbits of Greeley County High School of Tribune 25-9 and 25-11. The match's first game was highlighted by a pair of long service runs, one by freshman Dani Bedore to give the Cowgirls a big lead early, and the other by senior Tomi Windell to close out the game.

The start of the second game was a different story however, when three straight service errors by Goodland left the score tied at six. Coach McKee called a time-out, after which senior Alisha McKee produced a 10-point service run to make the score 17-6. The game's winning point was kept alive by some spectacular defensive play by the Cowgirls and finished off by a spike by A. McKee.

Goodland's second match was against the Coyotes of Weskan High. In the first game, the Coyotes played even ball with the Cowgirls. With the score tied at 11, Goodland took charge, outscoring Weskan 14-5 to win 25-16. The second game started out like the first, but with the Coyotes leading 10-8, senior Janae McKee produced a 9-point service run giving the Cowgirls a good lead. Bedore finished the game with two service aces to win it 25-14.

Goodland's final opponent of the night was Coronado High School. Both teams were 2-0 in the meet going into the match. The first game saw the Cowgirls open up a 5-0 lead early eventually increasing it to 10-2 and then with the score 20-12, winning the next five point for the 25-12 win. The second game was a much different story as Coronado stepped up its play and stayed even with Goodland in a game that saw several lead changes. With the score tied at 22, the Cowgirls won three of the next four points to win their final game of the night 25-23.
