The Goodland Star-News The Goodland Cowboys beat the Oakley Plainsmen 28-27 by a matter of feet Friday in a battle that was decided just before the final minute. Emotions were running high on and off the field as the Cowboys

faced off against the Plainsmen in the Cowboys' homecoming match. Despite the festivities, the Cowboys managed to focus on the game, and they needed to. Oakley, a fellow

Northwest Kansas League competitor, put up quite a fight. Goodland came out strong, put-

ting up a 14-point lead before the middle of the second quarter, but Oakley fought back, making the second half a tug-of-war between the two teams.

If not for stopping the Plainsmen two feet from the goal line on a crucial two-point conversion with only 1:07 left on the clock, the Cowboys would have needed a last-minute score to avoid losing by a point.

"What a game!" Coach Tony Diehl said.

The top three teams in the league, Goodland, Atwood and Oakley, are separated by three points, he said. The Cowboys lost to Atwood by one point last week, Oakley lost to Atwood by one and now to Goodland by one. That left Goodland with a 4-1 record, Oakley 3-2.

Lance Tedford was crowned homecoming king and Tomi Windell queen at half time. First attendants were Malcom White and Lauren Gray, second attendants Ian Scherling and Cortney Schields.

In his post-game talk, Coach

keep on top. And in the end, it came down to a two-point conversion.

"There were so many opportunities to fold," Diehl said, "but we didn't. We stuck with it, made plays when we had to."

The Cowboys made the first mark with a four-yard run by White with 6:27 to go in the first quarter. Scherling kicked the extra point.

An eight-yard pass from Jared Doke to Derrick Raymer and another kick from Scherling put the Cowboys up 14-0 with 8:10 to go in the second quarter.

Oakley's offense jumped in the game with a 48-yard touchdown run from Cody Sattler with 7:24 to go in the first half. Bobby Dennis' rush for the two-point conversion failed. The Plainsmen added the next score with a 29-yard touchdown

pass from Drew Siruta to Matt Smith. Siruta's pass for the twopoint conversion failed. Oakley was within two points; score 14-12.

A 27-yard pass from Doke to David Livengood with 3:22 to go in the third and another kick from Scherling put the Cowboys up 21-12. Two minutes later. Oakley decided to make it close again, a 14yard pass from Siruta to Smith putting the score at 21-18. Siruta's pass for the two-point conversion failed. Then Sattler kicked an 18-yard field goal to tie the score at 21 with

5:30 to go in the fourth. With just under two minutes to

go, a two-yard run by Jordan Bedore and another Scherling kick gave the Cowboys a more comfortable margin, 28-21.
