Brewster Bulldogs takes big bite out of Triplains Vikings, 54-6

 The Brewster High Bulldogs got back on the winning track in a big way with a 54-6 football rout of Triplains on Friday in Winona.

Brewster, still smarting after its first loss, opened on defense and shut the Vikings out in four plays. The offense took the ball on their 38 and promptly scored on the first play, a 20-yard pass from Branson Gilley to Heath Baird, who scampered down the sidelines into the end zone.

Gilley found Baird again for a 2-point conversion and the score stood at 8-0.

By the end of the first quarter, the score was 28-6. Sean Swanson scored on a four-yard run at second and goal and Gilley kept the ball for a five yard run, also on second and goal, with Joel Selby scoring the conversion.

Triplains' only score came on a 25-yard quarterback keeper by Jordan Barrett with 3:57 left. Swanson, however, promptly ran the kickoff back for a touchdown, making the

score 28-6.

Swanson also made the next score, on the first play of the second quarter, capping a nine-play drive that began with a Baird interception on the Triplains 38.

Jarrett Carpenter recovered a fumble on the kick return and set Brewster up on the Triplains 27, which culminated in another touchdown run by Baird, who also ran the conversion and made the score 42-6.

Darren Howard made the last score of the half on a one yard run

with 5:57 on the clock.

Brewster got into the end zone twice in the second half. A Swanson touchdown with 10:59 left was called back and Gilley ran the ball in with 6:09 left, ending the game on the 45-point rule.

The aerial game, not Brewster Coach Leland Francis' normal style, produced big results. Brewster had 148 yards total offense in the first quarter, with 120 coming in the air.

Total offense for the 'Dawgs was 328 yards, with 184 coming in the

air. Triplains had 168 yards, with 144 on the ground and 122 in the first quarter.

Gilley passed 10-for-7 for 150 yards and Baird went 3-for-2 and 34 yards. Baird also had 80 yards on three catches.

Jake Long had 83 yards on four catches and Paul Flanders had a single catch for 21 yards.

Gilley had 40 yards on six carries. Long ran for 34 yards on four carries. Swanson had 25 yards on five carries. Selby had 17 yards on five carries. Howard had two carries for

two yards each. Carpenter had an eight-yard carry, Chad Somers had a five-yard carry, Baird had a one-yard carry, and Tyler Johnson had a carry for no gain.

Swanson, Long and Josh Ryan had four tackles each. Carpenter also had two sacks among three tackles. Howard had three, Flanders had two and Somers, Baird, Garrett Smith and Johnny Siruta one apiece.

Brewster's next game is on the road against the Healy Eagles at 7:30 p.m., Friday.

Goodland defeated three of its opponents in straight games. The Cowgirls defeated the Colby Eagles 25-14 and 25-16, the Shockers of Wheatland 27-25 and 25-13 and the host team Oakley 25-13 and 25-21.
