star-news Sports **Cowboys out to tame undefeated Ulysses Tigers**

The Goodland Star-News The Goodland Cowboys have played three close games in the last three weeks and that can be tough on a team, especially when you're on the wrong end of the roller Heiter is playing well in his first coaster.

Coming off a last-second loss in Oberlin on Friday, the Cowboys have to muster up their courage and determination going into tonight's game against the Tigers of Ulysses High School.

Three weeks ago, the Cowboys lost to Atwood in overtime, 10-7. A week later, they got by the Oakley Plainsmen 28-27, stopping them less than two feet from the goal line during a two-point conversion.

Last Friday, the Cowboys were on the wrong side of a one-point loss to the Oberlin Red Devils, 20-19, who never lead until the last 30 seconds of the game. That apparently cost the Goodland boys their spot in the state rankings. Ulysses, one of the teams that moved onto the list, may be tough.

Coach Tony Diehl said that he expects a physical game. The Tiger defense is aggressive against the run, he said, and Ulysses has the most active linebacking crew he has seen this year. They have a nose guard who was last year's state heavyweight wrestling champion.

On offense, Diehl said, the Tigers' quarterback is a threat to score at any time. On offense, Ulysses has proven it can put points on the scoreboard, winning three of its last four game by 34 points or more.

Diehl said his team is healthy, except for sophomore running back Bobby Miller, who is still hampered by sore ribs. His status is "day-byday."

Senior offensive lineman Matt season with the team, Diehl said; he is a steady performer and is quickly learning the blocking schemes.

Senior running back Jordan Bedore continues to lead the Cowboys in rushing with 796 yards on 148 carries and has scored eight touchdowns. Miller is second with 468 yards on 69 carries and four touchdowns.

Senior quarterback Jared Doke has completed 16 of 35 pass attempts for 256 yards and four touchdowns. He is third on the team in rushing with 288 yards on 53 carries and ran for four touchdowns.

Juniors Derrick Raymer and Brock Lohr both have five pass receptions to lead the team. Raymer has gained 87 yards and scored two touchdowns. Brock has 74 yards.

Junior David Livengood has only three recpetions so far this season but two of them have gone for touchdowns. Senior Ian Scherling also has three catches one of which was for a touchdown

Senior Malcolm White has returned 11 kickoffs for 215 yards with his longest being 27 yards.

Three other teams, besides Goodland, dropped out of the Class 4A top 10. One of the teams entering the list this week is Ulysses at No. 7. The Tigers are 6-0 overall and is their tickets on them, as ushers will 4-0 in the Mid-State League.
