

Goodland runners disappointed with league results

Good expectations failed to materialize Saturday morning for the Goodland High cross country teams at the Northwest Kansas League Cross Country Championships held at the Sugar Hills Golf Course.

The Colby High girls dominated their race and the competition was close in the boys race between Quinter and Colby.

Colby won the girls championship with a score of 17 by having the top three runners and five of the top six. Oakley was second with 49, followed by Oberlin with 78 and Quinter with 91.

The Colby boys, despite having the top two runners, could not overcome Quinter's team performance. The Bulldogs placed four in the top 12 including the third and fourth place runners and scored three points better than Colby, 44 to 47.

Goodland took third with 56 points, Hoxie was fourth with 96, Oakley fifth with 118 and Oberlin sixth with 137.

"It was a disappointing day for us," Coach Don Smith said. "We just didn't perform, as a team, up to our capability."

The Lady Eagles' Jessica Stephens was the top finisher in the girls 2-mile race finishing in 12 minutes 43 seconds. Teammates Ivy Ramsey was second in 12:56 and Erica Erickson third in 13:02.

Oakley's Amy Hoff was able to

run with the Goodland team all year.

Colby's Shane Stover won the boys race, about 3.1 miles, in 18:04 followed by teammate Derek Elliott in 18:17. Quinter's Levi Simon was third in 18:21 and Austin Powers fourth in 18:28.

Freshman Derek Mason was the top Cowboys' runner, finishing fifth in 18:33. Senior Speedy Aguilar finished seventh in 18:48 and junior Craig Mason 11th in 19:28.

Other Goodland runners were junior Daniel Blake (14th, 19:36), junior James Cearley (19th, 20:16), sophomore Brandon Zelfer (25th, 21:02) and sophomore Zach Breininger (33rd, 22:45). Freshman Kyler Knobbe of Wallace County finished in 22:21.

Smith said that he hoped to get more runners in the top 10 in both races and thought that the boys had just as good a chance of winning the championship as the other two teams.

Goodland's next race will be the Class 4A regional meet next Saturday in Larned. The runners from Sharon Springs will compete in their Class 1A regional in Dighton, also on Saturday.

Sophomore Chelsea Ontiveroz did not compete at the league meet due to injury and is waiting for medical clearance for Saturday.

The top three teams at the regionals qualify for the state meet, with the top 10 individuals automatically qualifying. Should that number include less than five runners not on a qualifying team, then individuals will be selected, by order of finish, for the state meet until that number is reached.

Brewster top seed at regional volleyball tournament

The Brewster Lady Bulldog volleyball team has a first round bye in today's Class 1A regional volleyball tournament in Brewster.

The tournament begins at 2 p.m. (Central Time) with a match between the Cougars of Cheylin High of Bird City and the Wildcats of Wallace County High from Sharon Springs. Other teams in the tournament include Atwood and Greeley County High from Tribune. The top

two teams advance to the sub-state tournament.

The Bulldogs' first match will follow the Weskan/Triplains match when they take on the winner of the Cheylin/Wallace County match. Brewster enters the tournament with a 23-8 overall record.

Brewster was third in Saturday's Western Kansas Liberty League tournament, hosted by Brewster. The Bulldogs finished the tourna-

ment 3-2. They opened pool play with a loss to Wheatland 25-23 and 26-24, then defeated Wallace County 25-19 and 25-23, and Weskan 25-15 and 25-10.

Brewster lost to the Grinnell War-

riors 25-18 and 25-22 in final bracket play. The Bulldogs defeated Cheylin 25-22 and 26-24 in the consolation match. Grinnell won the tournament, beating Wheatland in the championship 25-16 and 25-22.

page and is reprinted here.

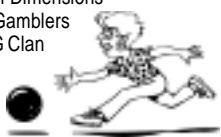
