Cowgirls win a trip to state

2003 state Class 4A volleyball championship tournament this weekend in Salina for the first time since 1999 after knocking off Scott City in the finals of the sub-state tournament.

Goodland won the sub-state Saturday by defeating the Scott City Lady Beavers soundly in the finals, 25-13 and 25-21. The Cowgirls are now 33-2 and will take a 28-game winning streak with them to the last tournament of the season.

The girls defeated the Larned Indians 25-9 and 25-8 in their first match Saturday. The Cowgirls met the Hugoton Eagles in the semi-finals, winning the first game 25-14 but losing the second 25-23. They got by the third 15-12.

Against Larned, Goodland started slow, but with the scored tied at 5, the Cowgirls went on a 20-4 point run. This show was highlighted by senior Kelsey Herl's 8point service run to finish the game.

Herl produced another 8-point service run early in the second game to push Goodland to a 10-2 lead, after which the Cowgirls outscored their opponent 15-6. Senior Alisha McKee finished the game off with a 7-point run.

Goodland's semi-final match with Hugoton was the toughest for the Cowgirls that day. In its first game, Goodland appeared to carry the momentum built up in the first match. Herl produced her third 8point service run to give the Cow-

They kept it until the Cowgirls fought back to tie the game at 21 on two consecutive service aces by senior Courtney Shields. The Eagles then regained a 2-point lead and held off Goodland to win 25-23.

The third game seemed like a continuation of the second as the teams played to an 11-point tie before the Cowgirls won the game, and the match, by taking four of the next five points.

Scott City earned its way to the championship match by defeating Colby, the host team, 25-15 and 25-18. and then Ulysses 25-16 and 25-13 in the other semi-final.

Herl's serving game helped give Goodland an early 7-1 lead in the final's first game, then with the score 9-3 freshman Dani Bedore produced a 9-point serving run to push the lead to 18-3. The Beavers went on a short run of their own, closing the score to 18-9, but the Cowgirls maintained the edge, winning the game 25-13.
