9. Serve dessert at the table.
10. End the night early.

Whole Baked Onions

10 medium to large yellow onions, unpeeled
10 tablespoons butter
salt and pepper to taste
Preheat your oven to 350 degrees.
Place onions side by side root end down in a baking pan. They will help support each other. Bake until ten-

der about 45 minutes.
With a sharp knife make an X about two inches deep in the top of each onion. Peel back the layers like petals of a flower. Insert 1 tablespoon of butter in each one and

season with salt and pepper. Serve hot. Serves ten.

This is a simple way to dress up steak, chicken, fish or roast.

Best Homemade Mustard

One 4 ounce can dry mustard
3 large eggs at room temperature
1 cup vinegar
1 cup sugar
Place the ingredients in a medium sized, heavy bottomed, nonreactive pan over low heat. Cook, stirring

constantly with a wooden spoon until the consistently of mayonnaise, about eight minutes. Do not loosen any burned pieces that stick to the bottom of the pan. It looks bad and not help the taste. Don't boil.

Remove from heat and let cool to room temperature. Place in jars and refrigerate. Keeps at least six months. Makes 3 cups.

Baked Bacon Bread Sticks

18 crisp breadsticks
18 strips thinly sliced bacon (Don't use very lean bacon it won't stick to the sticks.)
1/2 cup firmly packed dark brown sugar
2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
Preheat oven to 300 degrees.

Wrap a bacon strip around each bread stick. Sprinkle with brown sugar and a few drops of Worcestershire sauce.

Place the bread sticks on a wire rack over a baking sheet and bake until browned and crispy. It will take 10 to 15 minutes.

Makes 18 bread sticks.

Spicy Pecans

1/2 cup butter (1 stick)
1/4 cup vegetable oil
1/4 cup dark soy sauce
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
2 tablespoon Tabasco sauce
1 1/2 pounds pecan halves
1 tablespoon curry powder
1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
2 teaspoons ground cumin
1 tablespoon chili powder
1 cup sugar

Preheat your oven to 375 degrees.

Combine butter, oil, soy sauce, Worcestershire and Tabasco in a small saucepan over medium low heat. Heat, stirring until butter is melted.

Put pecans in a large mixing bowl and pour mixture over them. Toss to coat well.

Spread nuts evenly in a single layer on an ungreased baking sheet with sides. Bake in upper third of oven. Stir a few times until pecans are browned and fragrant, eight or ten minutes.

Transfer to a sheet of waxed paper and cool in a single layer for at least 1 hour. Break up clumps. This can be stored in a sealed container for several months.

Makes three cups.
