"I can say I beat the state champion," Speedy said. He finished ahead of Wildin at the regional meet in Larned on Oct. 25, which was won by Forward. Speedy was third at regional with a time of 16:36. Forward won with a time of 16:04.

Colby's Jessica Stephens was the individual state champion, winning the two-mile race in 11:39.04. Ivy Ramsey was seventh at 12:20.97, and Erika Erickson was 14th at 12:34,64. All three Colby girls received medals and All State honors.
