The Cowgirl volleyball team brought home the Kansas Class 4A high school championship trophy after defeating the Baldwin Bulldogs on Saturday, 25-14 and 25-20, in the title match.

This is Goodland High's fourth state title ever and its second under Coach Jerry McKee. McKee's first title with the Cowgirls came in 1988. Goodland won its first title, as a Class 3A school, in 1974 under former coach Sheila Stiles. In 1981 the Cowgirls won its first Class 4A state championship under coach Sandy Weaver.

The Cowgirls finished the season 38-2 without losing to a team from Kansas. Seniors Tomi Windell, Kelsey Herl, Janae McKee, Courtney Schields and Alisha McKee ended their high school careers as state champions

In their first match of the state tournament, the Cowgirls defeated the Thunderbirds of Circle High School in Towanda 25-20 and 25-23. The teams tied the score in the first game six times, but at 19, Goodland went on a 6-1 run to win. The second game was even closer than the first, as the teams tied the score 10 times, but with the score tied at 23, the Cowgirls took the next two points to go 1-0 in the tournament.

Goodland held a 17-11 lead against the Chanute Comets in the first game of its second match. However, the Comets fought back to tie the score at 18. From then on, the teams took turns taking a 1 or 2point lead until with the score tied at 26. Then with Bedore serving, a kill by A. McKee gave the Cowgirls a 1-point lead. A. McKee then blocked a Comet spike on the next play for the Goodland win, 28-26.

In the second game, Goodland jumped out to a 7-1 lead, keeping it until the Indians came back to tie at 12. Clearwater took its only lead a point later, only to have the game tied again at 13. Herl then produced a 3-point service run, including an ace, to give the Cowgirls the lead 16-13

Although Clearwater managed to get within one point twice, Goodland did not lose the lead during the rest of the game. A kill by Bedore for the winning point made it 25-22 and sent the Cowgirls into the title match.
