To make the marinade combine soy sauce, pineapple juice, vinegar, garlic, ginger, honey and pepper in a mixing bowl. Add the pork loin and marinade for 3 to 4 hours.

To make the catsup in a saucepan combine the apricots, vinegar, onion, sugar, ginger, garlic, pepper and salt.

Cook for 10 to 12 minutes over medium heat. Stir occasionally. Remove apricot mixture from the heat and process in a food processor until smooth. Pour into a serving bowl.

Preheat grill.

Remove pork from the marinade and drain. Discard marinade. Place meat on lightly oiled grill and cook for 5 to 7 minutes on each side until pork is done in the center.

Transfer to warm plates and spoon apricot catsup on the top. Serves 4.
