Lt. John Eichkorn with the Kansas Highway Patrol in Topeka said the officers, Lt. Greg Jirak and Troopers Terry Kummer and Mitch Nollette, had been placed on administrative leave after a Sept. 22 shootout and chase in Thomas County.

Bryant was charged with five counts of attempted first degree murder for firing at troopers Kummer and Nollette, Sheriff Jones and deputies Rod Taylor and Jason Moses. He is being held in the Thomas County Jail on \$1 million bond.

A first appearance hearing, scheduled for Oct. 16 was postponed because Thomas County Attorney Allan Taylor asked for a continuance.

Bryant's passenger, Brian E. Berry, also of Inyokern, Calif., was caught trying to escape through a field during the chase.

Bryant stopped to let him out, and he told officers the driver had vowed not to be taken alive. Berry also is being held in the Thomas County Jail.
