The Bulldogs came out firing, scoring their only touchdown on the second play of the eight-man game. Branson Gilley found Heath Baird open in the end zone from the Mustang 39. The extra point failed, but the 'Dawgs led 6-0.

Sylvan Grove scored on its first possession as well, on a run by Lucas Wiegert. The Bulldogs stopped the conversion to leave the score tied at six with 9:38 left.

Gilley was intercepted by Scott Stecklein on the second play of Brewster's next drive, giving the Mustangs possession on the Brewster 37 and leading to a Grant Heller touchdown with 7:08 left in the first quarter.
