

Grant Mustangs win six of eight

The Grant Junior High 8th grade boys basketball A team earned its second win of the season Tuesday while the B team picked up its second loss Tuesday against the Tigers of Hoxie Junior High.

The A team defeated Hoxie 48-45 after outscoring the Tigers 13-5 in the final period of the game. Jance McKee led the Mustangs with 22 points, followed by Tanner Smith with nine. T.J. Hawkins scored seven points, Forrest Trachsel six and Ben Davis had four.

The 8th grade A team defeated Burlington 55-44. McKee led the Mustangs with 23 points. Casey Henderson and Spencer Windell each added six points. Trachsel scored five points.

Other players scoring in the game were Josh Doke and Smith with four points each. Dustin Pennington, Darrick Ihrig and Hawkins each had two points, and Grant Wilkens one.

The 8th grade B team lost its game 31-21. Preston Dautel led Grant with 10 points with Jake Kling and Deeds each adding four. Krayca had two points and Pennington one.

The 7th grade A team won its game against the Cougars, 41-26.
