

Bedore on his way to Kansas State

Goodland High star running back and linebacker Jordan Bedore has committed to play football next year at Kansas State University.

Bedore said one of his dreams has always been to play in the Big 12 Conference, especially for the Wildcats. That was realized last Wednesday when he got the call from K-State.

Bedore was a first team All-League selection as a running back and as a lineback by the Northwest Kansas League. Coach Tony Diehl said that Bedore's first team selection for both positions was no surprise, but that the voting was close. "There were four teams with two league losses," said Diehl, "and almost all of them had great backs and great linebackers."

In 11 games at fullback for the Cowboys this season, Bedore ran for 1,685 yards on 271 carries. He averaged over six yards per carry and over 153 yards a game. His 18

rushing touchdowns and a pair of two-point conversions made him Goodland's leading scorer with 112 points.

As a middle linebacker, Bedore led the team in tackles with 145, 40 of which were solo. Eight of his tackles resulted in lost yards, including two quarterback sacks. He recovered two opponents' fumbles and intercepted one pass, which he returned for 22 yards.

Diehl credits Bedore's dedication, commitment and work ethic as a big part of the Cowboys' dramatic turn-around from the 0-9 team in 2001 to the 8-3 team this season that progressed two rounds into the state playoffs.

Bedore said he would be willing to red shirt his first season with the Wildcats if that is what the coaching staff wants. Diehl speculates that he might be a defensive end at Kansas State, however Beadier said the position he plays does not mat-

ter much.

Although Bedore and Kansas State have an oral commitment to each, the earliest he can sign his national letter of intent is Feb. 4 under NCAA rules.

Bedore said he considered the University of Tulsa and got inquiries from the Nebraska Cornhuskers and the Missouri Tigers, but Kansas State is the one he waited for.

Former Goodland player Ashley Hallagin ended the 2003 season leading the Lady Cardinals of Lamar University in assists and service aces.

The Colby Community College men's basketball team won all three of its games this weekend to improve to 7-0 for the season.

The Trojans defeated Central Community College (Neb.) 103-58 Thursday night to open the men's portion of the S&T Communications/Ambassador Classic in Colby. Sophomore center Justin Williams scored 25 points to lead Colby. Sophomore forward Dillion Sneed added 19.

On Friday, the Trojans defeated South Plains College 72-52. Sophomore forward E.J. Drayton led the team with 24 points. Sophomore guard Branden Miller scored 13.

After trailing by 13 points halfway through the first period, Colby fought back to lead New Mexico Junior College 41-38 at halftime and win the game 89-75. Freshman guard Orlando McKee and Drayton each scored 20 points to lead the Trojans, a career high for McKee. Miller added 19 points and Williams 17.

Drayton was the tournament's Most Valuable Player and McKee, Miller and Williams were named to the All-Tournament team.

The next action for the Colby men will be Saturday when they host the junior varsity team from Sterling College.

Lady Trojans win three games at home tourney

The Lady Trojan basketball team won all three of its games at the S&T Communications/Ambassador Classic in Colby this weekend to improve to 5-1 for the season.

Saturday, Colby defeated Independence Community College 70-69. Sophomore Jelena Spirc made two free throws with less than 5 seconds left in the game to win the game for the Trojans. She was Colby's leading scorer with 25 points.

Colby heads to Colorado Springs Friday to play in the U.S. Air Force Academy Prep School's tournament. The Trojans will play one game on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.
