
# You're outa here!

The Wildcats of Claflin High School defeated the St. Francis Indians 34-14 at home Saturday in the state Class 2-1A playoffs.

Claflin, now 12-0 for the season, travels to face the Owls of Garden Plain (11-1) in the state semifinals. The Indians finished their season 9-

For more than 11 minutes of the first quarter, the game was scoreless. However with 50 seconds left, Wildcat senior quarterback Mark Miller ran 33 yards on an option play for a touchdown and, with the extra point, Claflin had a 7-0 lead.

Less than three minutes and two Indian mistakes later, the Wildcats were ahead 21-0. St. Francis narrowed the lead to 21-8 with about a minute left in the half. Both teams were scoreless in the third quarter.

The Wildcats increased their lead to 28-8 early in the fourth quarter on a 4-yard touchdown run by Miller, his second of the game.

The defenses dominated the first quarter, as neither team could sustain a drive. However, with less than a minute left in the first quarter, Miller kept the ball on an option play and ran 33 yards for a touchdown. Claflin senior Corey Stiles extra point kick gave the Wildcats the lead 7-0.

The ensuing kickoff was high and short, which the Indians failed to cover, and the Wildcats went back on offense from the St. Francis 39yard line. Seven plays later junior running back Billy Webb ran 12 yards for a touchdown, and with Stiles' extra point, made the score 14-0.

After a short return on the subsequent kickoff, the Indians fumbled

The Wildcats scored 21 points in just over three minutes playing time during which St. Francis did not have an offensive play.

Starting on their own 20-yard line, after a touchback on the kickoff, the Indians drove 53 yards down to the Wildcat 27 but failed to convert on fourth-and-13. After two plays where they lost yards, it was the Wildcats' turn to lose a fumble. The Indians recovered on the Claflin 18.
