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Driving instructors meet

Volunteer instructors from across the state met in Topeka on Oct. 20-21 for the fifth annual meeting of the American Association of Retired Persons Driver Safety Program.

Those from northwest Kansas who attended the conference were Don Keihl of Goodland, Donna Farley of Brewster, Anise Gill of Norton and Leroy Moos of Oakley.

The national director of the program, Frank Carroll, told the group the number of driver safety graduates in the country has continued to grow. He said the program recently graduated its 9 millionth motorist, making America's roads a bit safer. The program, begun in 1979, is the

nation's first and largest classroom driver improvement course designed for motorists 50 and older.

"In Kansas last year, the program graduated 4,142 students, and to date we have exceeded that number for this year," said Roy Keller, state coordinator. "We've got great volunteer instructors and hope to recruit more members who would like to not only take the course, but become volunteer teachers as well."

Kansas instructors meet annually to learn about new driver safety issues and to hear the latest information about the nationwide program. The also heard from an occupational therapist about driver reha-

bilitation services, a Kansas Highway Patrol trooper about seat belt safety, a city traffic engineer about cameras at intersections, and the state director for pupil transportation about new rules for student transportation.

Kansas is one of 36 states and the District of Columbia that offer a discount on insurance premiums to course graduates. There are no tests and the course fee is only \$10. Classes are available statewide. Those interested in taking the Driver Safety course can call toll-free (888) 227-7669 to find a class in their area.
