The 500 scholarships will be given to the highest rated boys and girls nationwide in the 2003-04

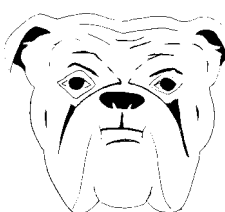

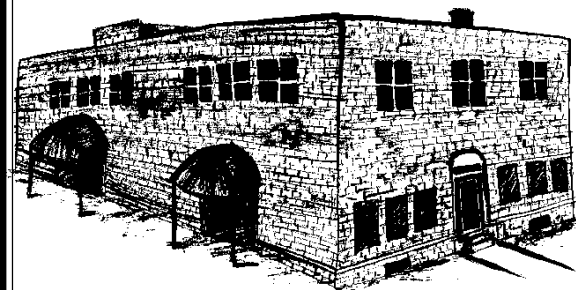
