

# Grant beats Quinter; Mustangs now 5-0

The Grant Junior High School eighth grade boys A team defeated the Bulldogs from Quinter 63-41 Thursday afternoon at Max L. Jones Fieldhouse.

Jance McKee led Grant with 18 points, shooting 4-for-4 from the free throw line. He also led his team in rebounds with eight. Darrick Ihrig and Forrest Trachsel each added 10 points for the Mustangs. Ihrig was 2-for-2 from beyond the three-point line.

T.J. Hawkins scored eight points and both Tanner Smith and Spencer Windell had five. Smith was second in rebounds with seven. Josh Duke scored three points. Grant Wilkens and Casey Henderson each scored two.

The A team was 5-0 for the season heading into Monday's game at Oakley.

The eighth grade B team also won its game against Quinter on Thursday, but by a much narrower margin, 18-17. Dustin Pennington led the Mustangs with eight points. Jason Krayca and Aaron Deeds each added four, and Preston Dautel two. Krayca led the team in rebounds with four.

The B Team was 2-5 going into Monday's game.

The Mustang seventh grade boys A team lost its game to Quinter 39-38.

"It was an exciting game," Coach Steve McCall said. "With the score

tied at 31 at the end of the third period, Quinter scored eight points on three field goals, two from beyond three-point range, while we scored seven points on three field goals and a free throw."

Andrew Taylor led Grant with 14 points followed by Greg Farris with 12. Rory Kling added six, Travis Angelos four and Clay Schilling two. Fernando Martinez led the team with five rebounds.

The seventh grade B Team defeated Quinter 10-9. Because of the low number of players on the Bulldog roster the coaches agreed, prior to the tip-off, the game would go only two periods.

Jace Mosbarger led the Mustangs with four points. Vance Johnson, Ryan Taylor and Schilling each scored two.

McCall said the players have improved at getting into position for rebounds. Martinez led the Mustangs with six in this game, followed by Schilling with four. Brennan Clouse and Mosbarger grabbed three each.

The seventh grade A team is 3-2 and the B team 6-1 heading into their games against Oakley.

The next home action for the seventh grade teams is next Tuesday against Scott City starting at 3:30 p.m. in the junior high gym at Max Jones Fieldhouse. All four Mustang teams will be home Thursday, Dec. 4, against Oberlin.

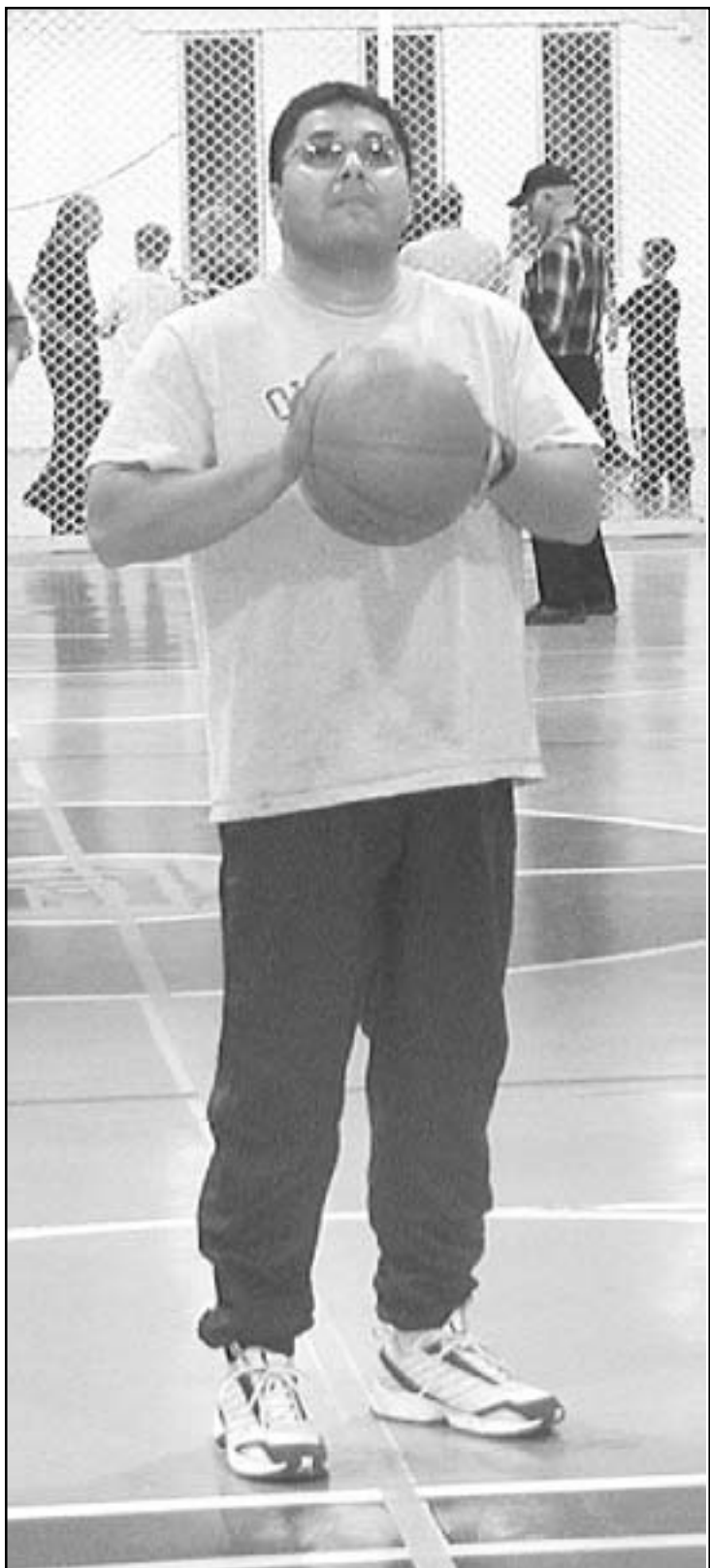
