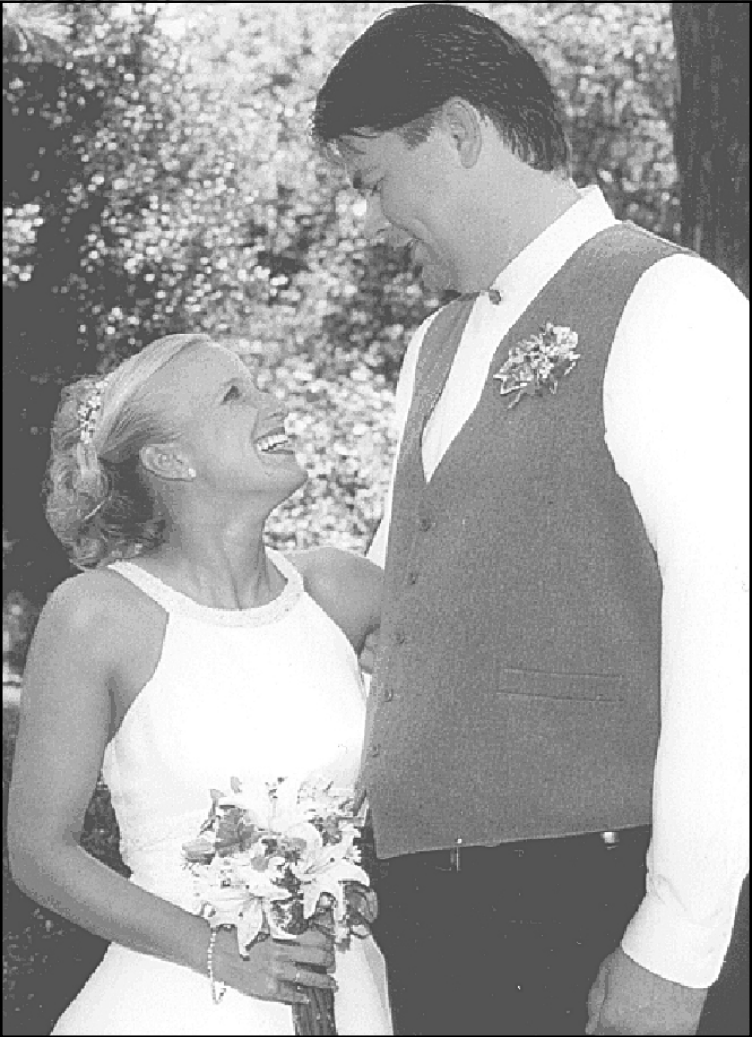
The club also decided to give Aaron Duell \$10 in dimes for the Clover House project.
