St. Francis teenager recovering from accident

Darin Brown is reported to still be in a coma but continues to improve.

Brown, a 19-year-old St. Francis man, was critically injured in a one-vehicle accident on Nov. 9. He was flown to a Colorado hospital but was recently moved to a rehabilitation center in Wichita.

Even though he was unconscious, he wiggled his toes and moved some fingers on his right

side. He was breathing on his own but several times, it appeared he was showing signs of pneumonia and other complications and antibiotics were started.

Brown made the trip to Wichita with no complications and it seems he is responding better to the physical therapy and is just more responsive overall, moving his hands and feet more and more.

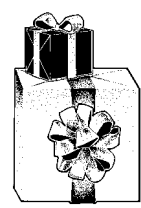
