Cowboys finish fourth; go 1-2 at Topside Tipoff

The Goodland Star-News The Goodland Cowboys finished fourth at the 2003 Topside Tipoff tournament held Thursday through Saturday at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

Goodland won its first game Thursday night, 92-60 over Burlington High. Friday, the Cowboys lost to McCook High, the eventual champions, 59-56. In the game for third place Saturday, Goodland led early, but the Blue Jays of Norton took over the lead during the middle of the second period and held on to win 64-58.

The tournament left the Cowboys 2-2 for the season.

The boys opened tournament play Thursday with a dominating 92-60 win over the Cougars of Burlington. Goodland never trailed, but the score was tied twice during the early minutes of the first period.

With the scored tied at 5, though, Goodland scored 11 straight points after which the boys continued to steadily increase their lead throughout the game. They led 28-14 after top 43-41. the first quarter, 49-29 at halftime and 74-42 after three.

"We did a lot of good things." Coach Jon McLean said. "I was really pleased how we handled their press at the start of the game. We got several easy lay-ups off some good passing.'

Junior Derrick Raymer led the Cowboys with 20 points, followed by senior Lance Tedford with 19, including 5-of-7 from three-point range. Junior David Livengood and sophomore Bobby Miller each scored 10 points. Raymer also led

rebounds.

"All 10 kids [who played] scored in the game," said McLean, "so it was a fun game to start the tournament with.'

Other players scoring for Goodland include junior Wade Taylor and sophomore Jase Herl, both of whom had nine points. Senior Jared Johnson and Drew Wilkens scored three each and junior Lane Winter two on a pair of free throws.

Friday, the Cowboys faced the Bison of McCook who defeated the Eagles of Wray High School Thursday 76-58. Goodland fell behind early and was down 14-7 at the end of the first period. The teams played even in the second period and McCook had a 29-23 lead at halftime

The Cowboys scored the first five points of the third period and closed to within one at 29-28. Then a few minutes later, they took the lead 35-34 on a basket by Tedford.
