The Goodland Star-News High school wrestling fans can see plenty of action starting at 8 a.m. Saturday, as the Cowboy's Holiday Classic tournament kicks off at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The 10 teams will be divided into two pools: Pool A comprises Goodland, Chapman, Norton, Ulysses and Hill City. Pool B has Burlington, Holton, Hoxie, Leoti and Scott City.

"I think there will be excellent competition at the tournament," Cowboys Coach Randy Bahe said. "Some really good teams are participating and some exciting matches will take place."

Each team will face every other team in its pool during one of five preliminary rounds at one of four mat locations on the main floor of the fieldhouse. The Cowboys will be on Mat 1 for all four of their rounds starting at 8 a.m. against Hill City.

The Cowboys take on Chapman in Round 2 starting about 9:30 a.m., Norton for Round 3 about 11 a.m. and Ulysses for Round 5 about 2:30 p.m.

The final round will begin at 4:30 with the top teams from both pools facing each other on Mat 1, with the No. 2 teams from each pool on Mat 2 progressing down, in the same pattern, to the No. 5 teams, which will compete in the junior high gym.

The Holiday Classic is organized for a team championship only, but trophies will be awarded to the Most Outstanding Wrestler, the quickest pinfall, and to any individual wrestler who goes undefeated during the tournament.
