# star-news Sports Norton wins Holiday Classic Goodland Cowboys fourth

By Greg Stover The Goodland Star-News The Blue Jays of Norton High School won the Holiday Classic wrestling tournament Saturday at Max Jones Fieldhouse, defeating the Scott City Beavers in the championship round.

The Goodland Cowboys finished fourth, losing to Hoxie in the final round between the two secondplace teams from pool competition.

"I was really pleased with the way the tournment turned out," Cowboy coach Randy Bahe said. "It was a competitive quality meet."

The tournament's 10 teams were divided into two pools of five. Each team faced each of the other teams in the pool during the five preliminary rounds of competition. The first-place teams from each pool faced each other in the championship, as did the two second place teams on down to the fifth place teams.

The order of finish for Pool Awas Norton, Goodland, Ulysses, Chapman and Hill City. Pool B's order of finish was Scott City, Hoxie, Burlington, Holton and Leoti

There were no individual champions recognized, however every wrestler who went through the day undefeated received a trophy. Three Cowboys were among the 22 undefeated wrestlers: freshman Brett Bahe at 103 pounds, senior Blayze Bahe at 119 pounds and senior heavyweight Jordan Bedore.

Bedore was named the Classic's Most Outstanding Wrestler and won the trophy for the fastest pin of the tournament, a nine-second effort over his opponent from Hoxie in the final round.

One of the highlights of the tournament was the heavyweight match between Bedore, the two-time defending state champion at 215pounds, and the defensing state heavyweight champion Tony Lewis of Ulysses. Bedore came away with a close 9-7 decision.

Coach Bahe said he was pleased with his team's overall performance, but felt the team was "a little flat" against Chapman. He said junior Chad Normandin had a succesful tournament Saturday and that junior Brandon Cowan would have undefeated except for a sub-par performance against Chapman. Bahe said both wrestlers improved a lot
