Dewey, the Manhattan millionaire, has filed suit in the district court of Riley county for separate maintenance. Mrs. Gertrude Dewey is the step-mother of Chauncey Dewey, whose mother was divorced some years ago and is now in Paris.

The petition filed by Mrs. Dewey does not differ from that filed every day in Kansas courts. Domestic infelicity, incompatible disposition and unhappy wedded life are the theme of many pages.

December 30, 1903: James Yarger Gets the Prize From Blue Valley Creamery Co. — Given a Cream Separator— 'Empire' is the Make of Separator and Is on Exhibit at John Bock's Hardware Store -Many Hundred in the Contest — James Yarger, living about eight miles southwest of town drew the \$100 Empire cream separator offered as a prize by the Blue Valley Creamery company at a drawing in St. Joseph, Mo.

Although living nearly at the extreme limit — a radius of 500 miles of St. Joseph—and out in the "short grass" country, Yarger was the lucky man out of many hundreds in the

Last year quite a number of Sherman county farmers had been shipping, individually, their cream

here last spring to try and increase their business at this point.

A receiving station was established at the Heston & Bartholomew feed store, and the firm contracted to receive and check the cream and make the regular daily shipments.

The agent while here sent out the circulars of the creamery company to offer as a prize an Empire hand separator, costing \$100.

All patrons could enter the contest, and the only condition made was the filling out and sending in a blank with name, residence, number of cows milked, amount of cream shipped, average test, etc. The percentage was a slim chance, but the lucky number — 1854 — held by Mr. Yarger, won.

The machine was shipped to John Bock and will be on exhibition for a few weeks in his hardware store, where anyone can inspect it. It was not only crated, but was packed in a finely built box, printed white inside and out with white and decorative stripped with carmine and gilt.

On the door of the box is a raised panel on which is the following let-

December 31, 1903: School Opens Monday — Eighth Grade and Up Resume Work After a Cessation of Several Weeks — The Goodland city schools will be opened Monday; scholars being admitted included the eighth grade
