star-news Sports Cowboys win close game with Quinter Bulldogs

The Goodland Star-News Everyone at Max Jones Fieldhouse on Tuesday knew it had come down to a last-shot win for Quinter or a squeeker for the Cowboys.

With 2.9 seconds on the clock, Quinter had the ball out of bounds under their basket.

On the inbounds, the ball went to sophomore Edward Machen who took the final shot for the Bulldogs. It came up short, giving the Cowboys the win, 72-71.

The Cowboys will be in action again tonight at Rawlins County when they face the Atwood Buffaloes on the road.

The game will be broadcast on KLOE Radio 730 AM beginning about 5:30 p.m. (Mountain Time).

Cowboy Coach Jon McLean said he thought the boys had flashes against the Bulldogs, flashes of looking good and flashes of not looking so good.

"We were fortunate to win that game," he said. "The last six minutes of the third quarter, we played our best, but I am frustrated with the way we can't seem to put four quarters together.'

The Bulldogs used a pressure defense, and in the fourth quarter it seemed to bother the Cowboys, who did not score for nearly three minutes, blowing a 14-point lead.

"We kind of quit attacking and guess the boys thought it was going to be easy after we built up the lead," McLean said.

"Sometimes we did a good job of breaking the press, and then we had trouble with it late in the game when we did not attack it very well and made some mistakes.

"I have to give the Bulldogs credit for working their way back to tie it up at 70-70.


