

Goodland wrestling club go to two tournaments

Wrestlers from the Goodland Wrestling Club were at tournaments in Atwood and Ellis.

Both wrestlers who went to Ellis on Saturday won gold medals in their weight classes in the 10-and-under age group. Aaron Avelar wrestled at 58 pounds and Ian Bonsall at 120.

At the tournament in Atwood on Saturday, in the 6-and-under, Gavin Wilson at 37 pounds was first, Chase Johnson at 49 pounds third and Tayton Weeter at 55 pounds fourth.

In the 8-and-under group, Tate Withington at 49 pounds was third, Dawson Ensign at 61 fourth, Tanner Gastineau at 67 third and Wence Hendrich at 67 fourth.

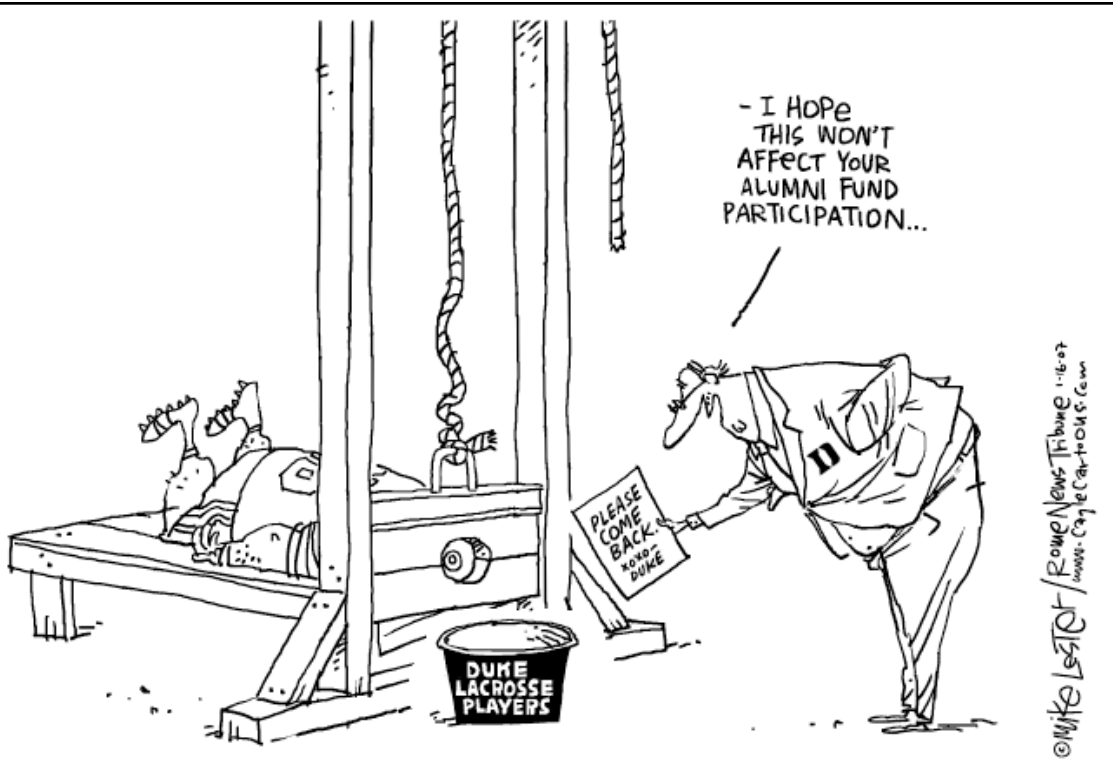

Junior Britt Zweygardt wrestled at 119, freshman Lorenzo Delgado at 130, sophomore T.J. Freeman at 125 and freshman Zach Prine at 171, all posting 0-2 records.
