# Cowboys lose twice, take fifth in Colby

The Goodland Star-News The Cowboys finished fifth at the 22nd Annual Paul Wintz Orange and Black Classic, losing to the Colby Eagles 49-44 on Saturday.

The Cowboys lost to Hays High, 82-46 on Thursday, and defeated the McCook Bison, 67-44, on Friday to reach the fourth-place game.




