## Cowgirls have basket trouble; lose to Lady Jays, 51-40

The Cowgirls had a hard time hitting the basket in a game with the Norton Blue Jays Tuesday losing 51-40.

This was their second loss of the year, leaving their record at 10-2. The Cowgirls are still undefeated in league action.

The next game for the Cowgirls is Friday 5:30 p.m. at Max Jones Fieldhouse against the Oberlin Red Devils.

"I think we have to give credit to the Norton team and the coaching staff," said Coach Don Smith. "The Norton team had an outstanding offense and defense and was well prepared."

Emily Murray made the first basket of the game. The game was played at a fast tempo and the Cowgirls had a hard time getting the basketball to go in. The Norton team as the game progressed took their time setting up their shots at the hoop. Norton had two players, Laura Lee Baird and Hayli Baird who scored in the double digits.

Norton lead 14 to 9 at the end of the first quarter,

27 to 20 at the end of the first half and 47 to 29 at the end of the third quarter. The Cowgirls defense all but shut down the Norton offense in the fourth quarter.

Play by the Cowgirls improved in the fourth quarter but they did not have enough time to overcome Norton's lead.

Of the six three-point shots the Cowgirls shot none scored. Norton made 50 percent of their three-pointers.

Goodland only made 47.2 percent of the two-point shots and only 50 percent of their free throws. Norton made 45.2 percent of their two-point shots but sank 72.7 of their free throws.

Murray had 10 rebounds, followed by Kaylee Billinger with four. Sammie Raymer, Lindsay Schields and Whitney Archer had three and Nicolette Clancy two.

Archer was the leading scorer for Goodland with 14. Murray made eight, Billinger seven, Schields five, Raymer four and Clancy with two.

"We played our weakest game of the year," said Coach Smith. "To their credit the girls never gave up."

less than estimated, and the bids on Caldwell were nearly exactly what had been estimated.

DeBoer and Neufeld agreed the lower bids were good, and will help with the costs on the remaining projects for the county.

DeBoer said he will begin the

design work on the five mile section of County Road 64, (Eighth Street) which is west of K-27 to County Road 14.

He said it might be difficult to get the survey work done on the one-mile section of Road 16 because of the snow.

Neufeld said he is waiting on the state for approval of the design

plans for the one-mile section of Road 14 at Caruso that runs past the ADM Northern Sun sunflower plant and the Goodland Energy Center.

The road projects are being paid by \$12 million in bonds issued in September, and being paid back through a one-cent sales tax the citizens approved in March.

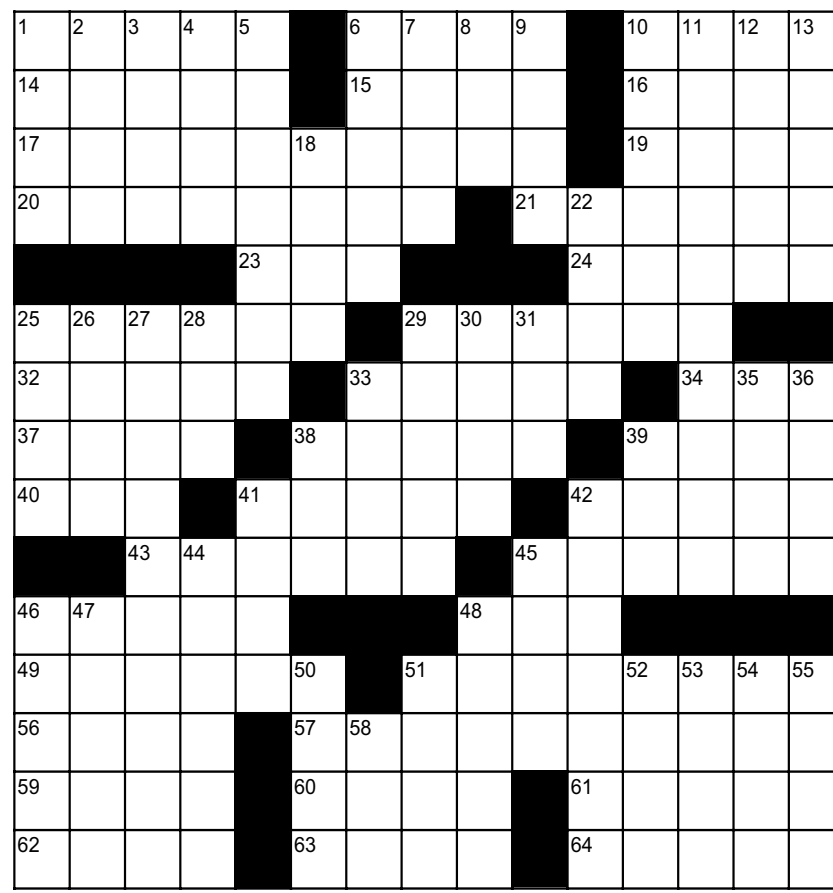
