Cowboys stomp Red Devils

The Goodland Star-News The Cowboys seemed to regain their shooting touch Friday as they outran the Oberlin Red Devils, 82-58, at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The win broke a two-game losing streak, and gives the Cowboys a 8-5 season record and a 3-0 league record. The Red Devils are 1-11 overall and 0-6 in league play.

The Cowboys are in action tonight in Garden City. This is the first of two trips south this week for the Cowboys. The game tonight begins at 6:45 p.m. (Mountain Time), and can be heard on KLOE 730 and on the Internet at network1 sports.com.

Friday the Cowboys will face the Saint Francis Indians at Max Jones, and travel to Dodge City on Saturday for games beginning at 5:30 p.m. (Mountain Time).

The Cowboys started slow against the Red Devils falling behind by 6 in the first quarter, but got on track in the second quarter and exploded in the second half for an 82-58 win.

"It was nice to see the kids get out and run up and down the floor," Coach Jon McLean said Sunday. "It was nice to see them shoot the ball.

"Our defense at times was not good, and these kids are going to have to improve in that area. We are going to be playing some good teams and we are going to have to get stops.

"All in all this game should get our kids some confidence for the stretch run of the season."

Two minutes into the game the Cowboys were having trouble hitting their shots, and were down 8-2 to Oberlin.

Nick Angelos cut the margin to 2, 8-6, on a pass from Greg Farris, and Cowboys tied the score at 10 on a fast break basket by Farris on a pass from Travis Angelos.

Tanner Smith tied the score again

basket to fall from outside the top of the key for the first Cowboy lead, 15-14.

Oberlin retook the lead, 16-15, but Nathan Linin made the second of two free throws with 1.8 seconds left to tie it at 16 at the end of the quarter.

Travis Angelos tied the score at 18 with 6:25 left in the half, and the Cowboys went on an 8 point run to lead 26-18 with 4:30 left.

Red Devil Lucas Juenemann hit a 3-point shot to cut the lead to 5, 26-21. On the next play Red Devil Jobey Black was called for a technical foul after Nick Angelos slid between two Oberlin players to tip in a basket making it 28-21. Smith made one of the two technical foul free throws to make it 29-21.

The Cowboys began to run and get some fast break opportunities. Farris got a steal and passed it to Nick Angelos who dunked the ball for a 31-23 lead.

Farris gave the Cowboys an 11point lead with a 3-point basket, 34-23, with 2:30 left.

Doll got a steal and a lay-up to make it 36-25 with 1:52 left in the half.

Farris hit another 3- point basket with under a minute left, and baskets by Nick Angelos and Smith on a steal by Nick Angelos made it 43-29 at halftime.

In the third quarter the Red Devils didn't score until the middle of the quarter and the Cowboys were leading 53-29.

A minute later the Cowboys got back-to-back lay-ups from Doll and Nick Angelos to make it 57-33.

The third quarter ended with the Cowboys leading 63-38.
