

# Cowboys sixth in 9-10 track meet held at home

The Cowboys came in sixth in a 9-10 track meet held here on Monday with 57 points.

St. Francis won the boys division with 115 points, Colby tied for second with Limon, Colo., at 84, Burlington had 71, Hoxie 70, Goodland 57, Ulysses 36 and Atwood 16.

The team posted two first-place

finishes in the meet. Zach Lohr won the high jump with a height of 5 foot, 6 inches.

Jay Cotter won the shot put with a throw of 38 feet, 2 inches. Ryan Taylor was fifth in the shot put with a throw of 34 feet, 9.5 inches. Cotter was third in the discus with a throw of 99 feet, 4 inches and Taylor was sixth with a throw of 94 feet,

1 inch. Weis of Hoxie won the discus with a throw of 115 feet, 3 inches.

Lohr was third in the 100-meter dash in 12.86 seconds. Radcliff of Hoxie won in 12.37 seconds.

Dallas Price was fifth in the 1600-meter run with 6:03.92. Herrera of Ulysses won the 1600 in 5:31.47.

Goodland was fourth in the

4x100-meter relay at 50.82 seconds. St. Francis won in 47.74.

Travis Angelos was sixth in the 400-meter dash at 1:01.13. Ewing of Limon won with 57.75. Price was sixth in the 800 meters at 2:40.66. Trujillo of Limon won in 2:21.40.

Angelos was fourth in the 200-meter dash at 27.21 seconds. Radcliff won the event in 25.73 sec-

onds. Ben Waugh was third in the 3200-meter run at 14:30.91, and Ismael Garcia was fourth at 14:57.60. Reed of Colby won the race in 13:12.86.

Trent Raile of St. Francis won the long jump with a mark of 19 feet, 7.5 inches and the triple jump at 36 feet, 7 inches.

Stickel of Colby won the pole

vault with a mark of 10 feet, 6 inches. Weis won the javelin with a throw of 122 feet.

Limon won the 4x800 relay in 9:43.52.

Kinen of St. Francis won the 110-meter high hurdles in 16.27 seconds and the 300-meter intermediate hurdles in 44.19. St. Francis won the 4x400-meter relay in 3:59.38.

# Cowgirls finish second in track meet

The Goodland Cowgirls finished second in a 9-10 track meet here in Goodland on Monday.

Hoxie won the meet with 125 points, Goodland had 84, Colby 76, Burlington 31, Limon, Colo., 30, Atwood 25, St. Francis 23 and Ulysses 4.

Alexis Bateman was third in the long jump with a mark of 13 feet 5.5 inches, and Elaine Reiter placed fifth with a mark of 12 feet 4.25 inches. Williams of St. Francis won the long jump with 14 feet, .25 of an

inch. Michelle Smith placed first in shot put with a throw of 30 feet 4.5 inches and in discus with a throw of 98 feet 10 inches.

Taylor McLamore won the 100-meter dash in 14.55 seconds, and Brittney Medrano was sixth at 15.84 seconds.

Medrano placed first in the 800-meter run with a time of 3:09.24. Medrano placed second in the 1600 meters at 6:42.60. Bontrager of Limon won the race with 6:37.35.

McLamore was first in the 200-meter run at 31.36 seconds, Cooper fourth, 33.14, and Jessi Geist sixth at 34.34.

Goodland was third in the 4x100-meter relay 1:00.8. Hoxie won the race in 58.02 seconds.
