

# Student works on display at arts center

## Youths' paintings eye catching

Animals etched in glass, a clown carved in wood, pottery, clay sculptures, oil paintings and pastels, landscapes, people, farm scenes, even a big blue eye are displayed at the Carnegie Arts Center this month.

Art by Goodland High School and Grant Junior High students will be displayed through April 30. The pieces were displayed in the Northwest Kansas League Art Show in Oberlin before appearing at the center.

Among the etchings greeting visitors as they enter are a pheasant by Bryan Guyer and a baby penguin by Kayler Rietcheck, both junior high students. A clown carved in wood by senior Molly Witzel hangs above the desk where visitors sign in.

Along the north wall, are hand-tinted photos, photo combining projects and mixed media projects by Grant students. A large oil painting of a waterfall in the mountains by sophomore Tanner Oharra draws attention to the west wall.

Also on the wall are oil paintings by Emily Murray and Nathan Linin, both seniors, and pastels by Candice Meissinger and Devin Mangus.

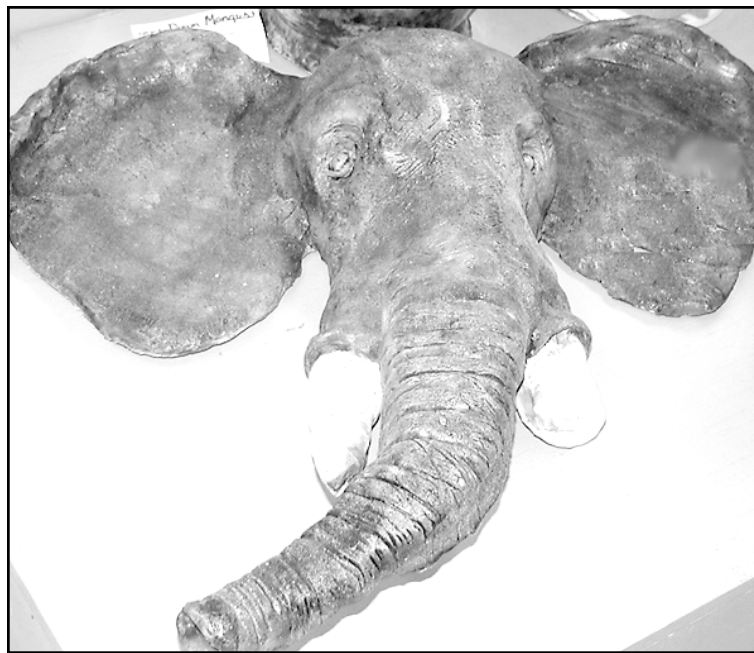
Below them are design projects of fish by Grant students and pastels of faces, also by Grant students. Jerrod Goodman, senior, and Witzel both have pencil drawings of barns on the west wall.

An assortment of pottery and clay sculptures are displayed in the center of the gallery, including a ceramic wolf by sophomore Devin Mangus, an elephant face by sophomore Brandon Rome, a blue glazed ceramic skull by freshman Tyler McDonald and pottery by Mangus, junior Renea Reasoner, senior Kaylee Billinger and senior Nicolette Clancy.

The arts center is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and from 1 to 4 p.m. Saturday, Sunday and Monday at 120 W. 12th.

## Workers get steak, jackets

The employees at the Goodland Wal-Mart SuperCenter got a steak and a jacket last Wednesday for setting a new safety record for stores its size of 757 days without an injury.

"It's nice," said Tris Todd, safety team leader. "Most of the time we get cookouts or lunches, but we get to take the jacket home."

Accidents for associates typically involve slipping and falling, cuts and injuries from falling merchandise, she said. The last one on record was March 14, 2005, for the Goodland store. The old record was less than 600 days.

"This is uncharted water for company incentives," Todd said.
