

Cowboys, Cowgirls run at Holcomb meet

The Cowboys finished seventh out of nine teams with 44 points and the Cowgirls were ninth with 30 at the Holcomb Invitational track meet on Friday.

Both teams will compete in their own home meet, the Goodland Invitational, at 2 p.m. Friday.

"Our kids are not in meet shape just yet, as our season got kicked off to a very slow start due to bad weather," said Coach Jonathan Dansel. "The kids have been working very hard and we will keep progressing as the season goes on."

The Scott City boys won the meet with 117 points, followed by Lakin, 105; Colby, 86; Ulysses, 51; Sublette, 46; and Ness City, 45. Behind Goodland were Holcomb, 34, and Hugoton, 25.

It was a competitive meet, Dansel said.

"The kids are looking forward to competing at home on Friday," the coach said. "I encourage the community to come out and support the kids this Friday. Bring the whole family."

Senior Kerek Mason was second in the 800-meter run at Holcomb, finishing in 2 minutes, five seconds.

Junior Grant Wilkens was second in the 110 high hurdles in 16.57 seconds; in the 300 intermediate hurdles, finishing in 46.4 seconds; and in the pole vault, at 11 feet, 6 inches.

Senior Nick Angelos was third in high jump, leaping 5 feet, 10 inches, and junior T.J. Hawkins was third in shot put, with a 46-foot, 3.5-inch toss. Junior Casey Henderson was fourth in the 100-meter race, finishing in 11.41 seconds.

Sophomore Zach Lohr was fifth in the high jump, leaping 5 feet, 8 inches. Finishing sixth were junior Bob Doxon in discus with a 129-foot, seven inch, toss and Nick Angelos in the long jump with a 19-foot, 6 inch, leap.

Henderson was seventh in the 200-meter race, finishing in 23.54 seconds.

Junior Jake Kling finished the 100-meter race in 12.18 seconds, sophomore Fernando Martinez the 200 meters in 25 seconds and the 400 in 58.96 seconds. Sophomore Vance Johnson ran the 400 in 64.55 seconds.

Junior Chris Geeseka ran 800 meters in 2 minutes, 47 seconds and

1,600 in 6 minutes, 36 seconds.

In the 4 x 100-meter relay, Henderson, Lohr, Travis Angelos and Martinez finished in 47.5 seconds. Johnson, Josh Lamb, Travis Angelos and Marcus Binger ran the 4 x 400 in 4 minutes, 14 seconds.

Doxon threw the shot 41 feet, 10.5 inches, and Henderson had a 39 foot, 5 inch toss.

Hawkins threw the discus 119 feet, 4 inches, and Jason Krayca 101 feet, five inches.

Junior Brett Meissinger threw the javelin 104 feet, 10 inches; Kling threw it 81 feet, 1 inch; and senior Nathan Thomas 75 feet, 3.5 inches. Lamb leapt 5 feet, 4 inches in the high jump.

In girls events, sophomore Michelle Smith was first in discus, throwing 92 feet, 8 inches. Senior Kaylee Billinger was second in high jump at 5 feet. Senior Stephanie Sheldon was second in pole vault at 8 feet.

Senior Emily Murray leapt 12 feet, 10.5 inches in the long jump, and Smith threw the shot 28 feet, 5 inches.

Murray was fourth in the 300 low hurdles, finishing in 51.85 seconds.

In the 100-meter race, Billinger finished in 13.53 seconds, and sophomore Taylor McLemore in 14.28. In the 200, Billinger finished in 27.21 seconds and McLemore in 29.68.

Sheldon ran the 800 in 2 minutes, 50 seconds, sophomore Brittany Medrano in 2:56 and senior Whitney Dautel in 3:06.

Medrano ran the 1,600 in 6 minutes, 26 seconds, and Dautel in 6:50.

Murray ran the 100 high hurdles in 18.85 seconds. In the 4x100 relay, Murray, McLemore, Sheldon and Billinger finished in 55.28 seconds.

The Cowboys were third out of four Class 4A schools while the girls finished last last Tuesday in Scott City.

For the boys, Henderson was second in the 100-meter race, finishing in 11.51 seconds. Kling finished in 12.11 and Krayca in 12.56.

Nick Angelos was second in long jump, 19 feet, 6 inches, and in triple jump, 40 feet, 3 inches. Martinez leapt 16 feet, 3 inches in the long jump, and Kaleb Keith 15 feet, 4 inches.

Wilkens was fourth in the 110 high hurdles in 16.81 seconds and fifth in the 300 intermediate hurdles in 45.44. Doxon was fourth in shot put, 44 feet 10.5 inches, and in discus, 118 feet 3 inches. Wilkens was fourth in pole vault, 10 feet, six inches.

Hawkins was fifth in shot, 44 feet 6.75 inches, and Henderson threw shot 40 feet, 11 inches. Hawkins threw the discus 105 feet and Krayca 93 feet.

Henderson was sixth in the 200-meter race, finishing in 24.03 seconds, and Lohr was sixth in high jump, with a 5-foot, two-inch, leap.

Martinez finished the 200-meter race in 24.5 seconds; Johnson ran the 400 in 64.09 seconds; Mason ran the 800 in 2 minutes, 13 seconds; and Geeseka in 2 minutes, 49 seconds.

Mason ran the 1,600 in 5 minutes, 2 seconds; Ben Waugh in 6 minutes, 1 second; and Dallas Price in 6 minutes, 13 seconds.

Waugh ran the 3,200 in 13 minutes, 8 seconds, and Ismael Garcia in 14 minutes, 28 seconds.

In the 4 x 100 relay, the team of Travis Angelos, Henderson, Lohr

and Mason finished in 48.43 seconds. Nick Angelos, Wilkens, Johnson and Martinez ran the 4 x 400 in 4 minutes, 1 second.

Kling threw the javelin 95 feet, Meissinger 94 and Thomas 79 feet, 3 inches.

For the girls in Scott City, Sheldon was first in the pole vault at 8 feet, 6 inches; Smith third in discus, 93 feet, 9 inches; Murray third in 300 low hurdles, finishing in 55.2 seconds; and Billinger third in the 100-meter race, 13.36 seconds, and fourth in the high jump, 4 feet, 6 inches.

McLemore ran the 100 in 14.13 seconds and the 200 in 29.96. Freshman Alexis Bateman ran the 200 in 31.3 and the 400 in 1 minute, 14 seconds. Sophomore Cassie Cooper ran the 400 in 1:17.

Medrano ran the 800 in 2 minutes, 57 seconds, and Dautel ran the 1,600 in 7 minutes, 7 seconds.

In the 4x100 relay, McLemore, Jessi Geist, Bateman and Sheldon finished in 57.66 seconds. In the 4x800, Dautel, Billinger, Medrano and Sheldon finished in 11 minutes, 28.43 seconds. Bateman leapt 11 feet, 7.5 inches, in the long jump.

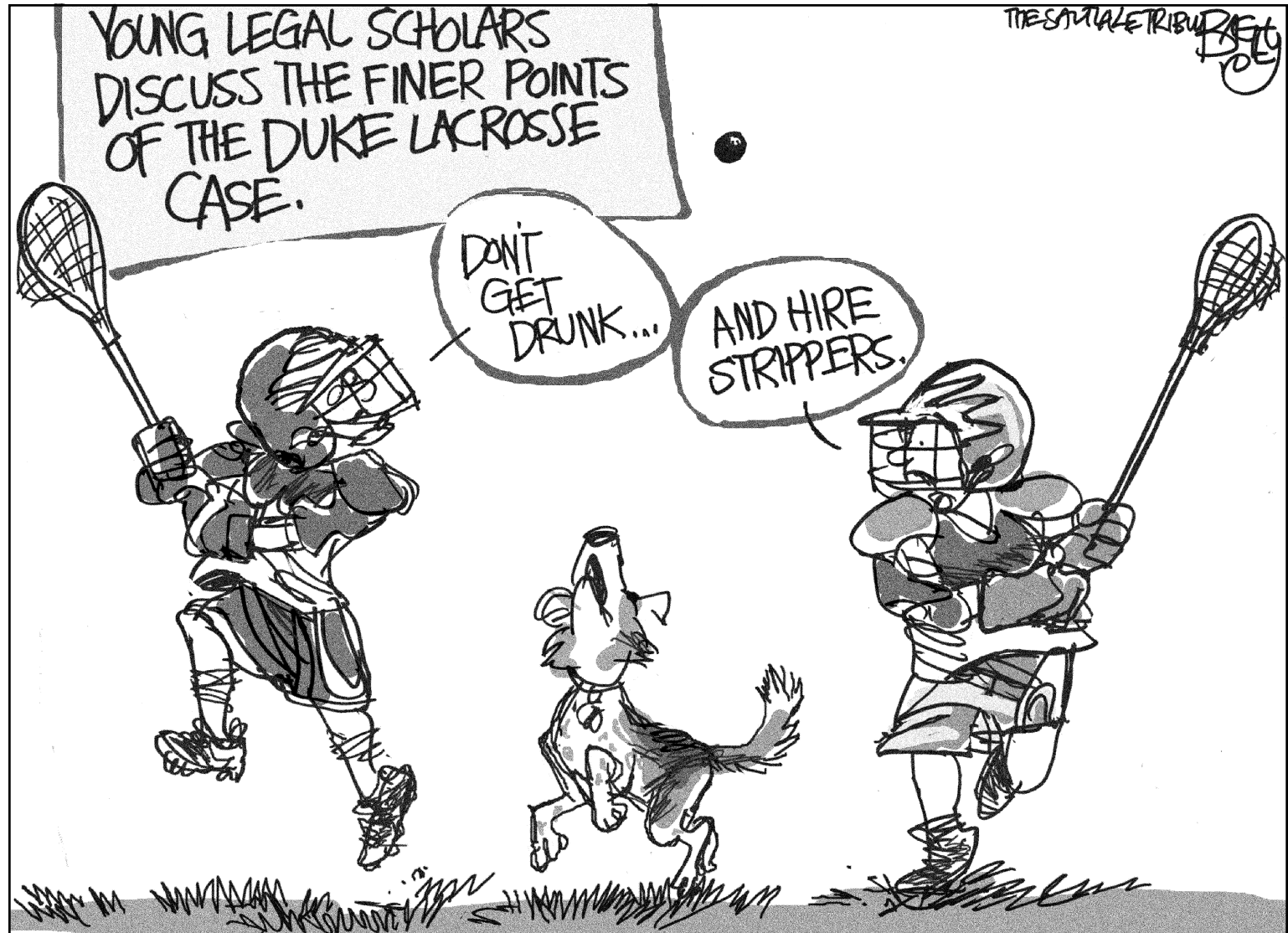

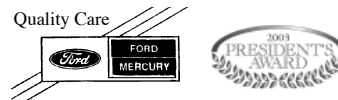
