

# Cowboys finish fifth at Norton

The Cowboys and Cowgirls both finished fifth at the Norton Invitational track meet, a make-up from an event originally scheduled for April 5.

Both teams will compete at their home meet, the Tri-State Relays, at 2 p.m. today.

At Norton, the boys were fifth out of seven teams with 56 points and the girls fifth out of six with 48. The Norton boys and girls won both meets, the boys with 151 points and the girls with 145. Phillipsburg was second, the boys with 123 points and the girls with 131.

The Colby boys were third with 100, followed by Smith Center with 81. Behind Goodland were Logan High with 34 and Northern Valley with 11.

The Smith Center girls were third with 82, followed by Colby with 52. Behind Goodland were the Northern Valley girls with 40 points.

"We finally had a beautiful day to compete, no wind, no rain and 68 degrees," said Coach Jonathan Dansel. "I was proud of all the kids for how they competed."

Nick Angelos brought home his first ever first-place medal in track in the long jump, Dansel said, Stephanie Sheldon did very well in the vault getting a personal record for competition in the event at 9 feet and T.J. Hawkins did a great job in the shot put taking second place.

Some of the kids are really starting to focus in on their workouts, the coach said, as some of them really want to qualify for the 4A Regional meet in Clearwater and go on to State from there.

For the boys, senior Nick

Angelos was first in long jump, leaping 20 feet, 1 and a half inch. Junior T.J. Hawkins was second in shot put, throwing 46 feet, 6 inches.

In third were senior Kerek Mason in the 400-meter run, finishing in 53.75 seconds; junior Bob Doxon in discus, throwing 130 feet, 3 inches; junior Grant Wilkens in pole vault at 11 feet, 6 inches; and Nick Angelos in triple jump, leaping 39 feet, 8 inches.

Junior Casey Henderson was fourth in the 100 meters, finishing in 11.65 seconds, and in the 200 meter in 24.12 seconds. Doxon was fifth in the shot put with a 42-foot, 10-inch, toss, and Hawkins was fifth in discus, throwing 119 feet, 2 inches.

The 4 x 100 relay team of Hawkins, Wilkens, Nick Angelos and Henderson was fifth, finishing in 46.62 seconds.

Hawkins finished the 100 meters in 12.12 seconds, and sophomore Fernando Martinez finished in 12.46.

Martinez finished the 200 meters in 24.83 seconds, and junior Jake Kling in 25.37. Nick Angelos finished the 400-meter race in 57.21 seconds, and sophomore Travis Angelos finished in 59.18.

Mason finished the 800-meter run in 2 minutes, 14 seconds, and junior Chris Geeseka finished in 2:53.

Wilkens finished the 110 high hurdles in 17.12 seconds and the 300 intermediate hurdles in 45.65.

Henderson had a 39-foot, 2-inch, toss in the shot put; junior Jason Krayca 36 foot; freshman Jay Cotter, 35 feet, 9 inches; and senior

Nathan Thomas, 28 feet.

In discus, Cotter threw 108 feet, 9 inches; Krayca 102 feet, 5 inches; and Thomas 65 feet, 9 inches.

Junior Brett Meissinger threw the javelin 113 feet, 5 inches, Kling 104 feet, 3 inches, and Thomas 75 feet, 4 inches.

In the long jump, Martinez leapt

14 feet, 8 inches, and Geeseka 11 feet, 9 inches.

In girls' results, senior Stephanie Sheldon was first in pole vault at 9 feet, and senior Kaylee Billinger was second in the 400-meter race, finishing in 65.81 seconds.

Billinger was third in the 100 meter, finishing in 13.18 seconds;

Sheldon was third in the 800 meter in 2 minutes, 51 seconds; and senior Whitney Dautel was third in the 1,600 meters in 6 minutes, 29 seconds.

Senior Emily Murray was fourth in 100 high hurdles in 17.3 seconds, fifth in 300 low hurdles in 52.4 seconds and fifth in long jump, 15 feet,

6 inches.

Dautel was fifth in the 800 meters in 2 minutes, 57 seconds, and Billinger was fifth in the high jump, leaping 4 feet, 10 inches. Sheldon finished the 100 meters in 14.25 seconds, and sophomore Michelle Smith threw the shot 29 feet, 10 inches, and discus 87 feet, 6 inches.

# Slow-moving storm spans multiple tornadoes in area

A Thomas County sheriff's deputy reported a car blown off of I-70 at mile marker 39 about 2 miles east of Brewster at 8:56 p.m.

Sirens were blown in Brewster beginning about 8:30 p.m. when the tornado was reported five miles south by radar image. A weather service employee gave the all clear for Brewster about 9 p.m. as the storm and possible tornado moved about three miles northeast of the town.

On the west edge of the growing storm, a weather service employee spotted a tornado seven miles northwest of Goodland at 9:04 p.m. from the weather office.

An amateur radio operator reported a funnel cloud six miles north-northeast of Levant at 9:36 p.m.

Engel followed the storm north of Levant while staying in touch by radio with Al Pietrycha, science and operations officer in Goodland, and followed it to the Rawlins County line. At times, Engel told Pietrycha,

the lightning would reveal what appeared to be a tornado in the storm, but at other times the storm was so intense any tornado would have been wrapped in rain.

Using a global positioning system connected to a spotter network, Pietrycha was able to see where Engel was and would tell him to move south or east depending on how the storm was moving to keep him out of danger.

Engel said at one point, the up-draft from the cell was getting very close, and he decided to head south.

Other tornado reports on Monday were three miles northeast of Haigler, Neb., at 10:35 p.m. by a Dundy County sheriff deputy, and two miles east of Wauneta, Colo., at 10:49 by a Yuma County sheriff's deputy.

Killingsworth said there were re-

ports of hail up to golf-ball size. Continued rain on Tuesday caused the weather service to issue a flash-flood watch for the Tri-state area into Wednesday morning. There were reports of water across the road near Eckley, Colo.
