The Kansas State Crop Planting Guide has set the suggested planting dates for corn in northwest Kansas as May 1-20

Many farmers push the early part of this time, trying to position corn to avoid pollination during the hottest part of the summer.

When studying historical planting data in 12 central United States corn-producing states, the key finding was that almost all states exhibited a significant shift to earlier planting.


