## Team runs at Oberlin

A small Goodland team earned only one gold and one silver medal at the Decatur Community High School Invitational track meet Tuesday, the Cowboys tied for seventh out of 10 teams and the Cowgirls were last.

The Cowgirls had a gold medalist and the Cowboys a silver medalist.

The Cowboys were tied with Oberlin with 35 points. Norton was first with 103, Phillipsburg second with 94 and Rawlins County third with 87, followed by St. Francis, 55; Smith Center, 53; and Hoxie, 52. In ninth and 10th were Oakley with 25 and Wheatland-Grinnell with 13.

A small Cowgirls squad earned 13 points. Oberlin won with 106, Norton second with 100 and Rawlins County third with 72.

Next were Oakley with 62, Smith Center with 61, St. Francis with 50, Phillipsburg with 43, Wheatland-Grinnell with 27 and

Hoxie with 24.

For the Cowgirls, senior Stephanie Sheldon was first in pole vault at 8 feet, 6 inches. Senior Kaylee Billinger was fifth in high jump at 4 feet, 8 inches, and sixth in the 100-meter race, finishing in 13.62 seconds, and in the 400-meter race in 1 minute, 7.51 seconds.

Senior Whitney Dautel finished the 800-meter run in 2 minutes 47 seconds, and Sheldon finished in 2 minutes, 52 seconds. Dautel finished the 1,600 in 6 minutes, 31 seconds.

Sophomore Michelle Smith had a 28-foot, 5-inch, toss in shot put and threw the discus 93 feet, 11 inches.

For the Cowboys, senior Nick Angelos was second in the triple jump, leaping 39 feet, 6 inches, and fourth in the long jump at 19 feet, 8 inches.

Junior Casey Henderson was fourth in the 100-meter race, finishing in 11.3 seconds, and in the 200-meter race in 24.44 seconds. Junior

Grant Wilkens was fourth in the 110 high hurdles in 16.15 seconds, and junior Bob Doxon was fourth in discus, throwing 120 feet, 4 inches.

Doxon was fifth in shot put with a 44-foot, 4-inch toss, and Angelos was fifth in high jump with a 5-foot, 6-inch leap.

The 4 x 100 relay team of Jake Kling, Wilkens, Angelos and Henderson was sixth.

Kling finished the 200-meter race in 26.6 seconds. Senior Kerek Mason finished the 800-meter run in 2 minutes, 3.78 seconds, and junior Chris Geeseka finished in 2 minutes, 50 seconds. Geeseka finished the 1,600-meter run in 6 minutes, 43 seconds.

Wilkens finished the 300 intermediate hurdles in 45.89 seconds and leapt 11 feet in the pole vault.

Junior Brett Meissinger threw the javelin 108 feet, 6 inches, while Kling threw it 100 feet, 11 inches, and senior Nathan Thomas threw it 82 feet.

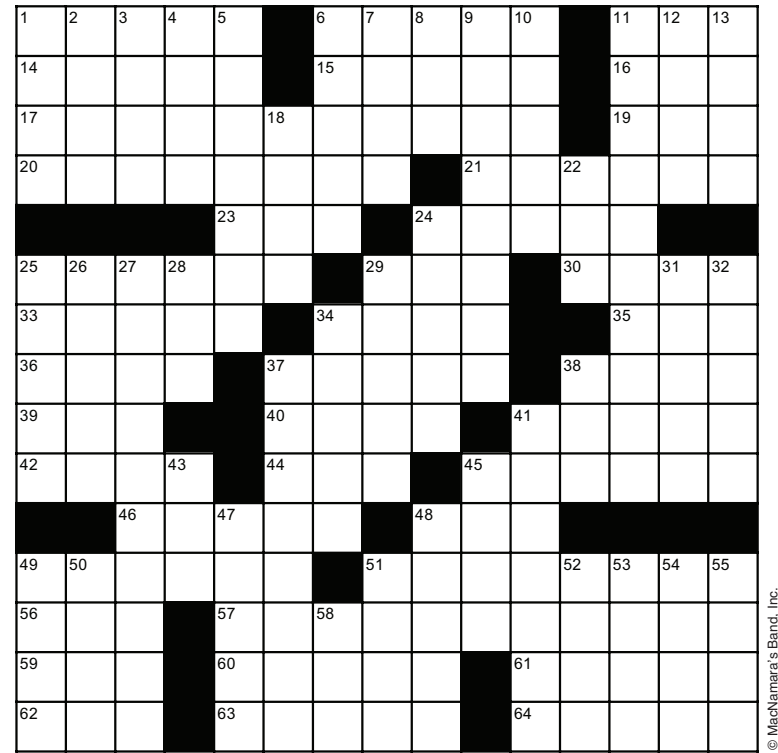
