For many farmers, May 15 is magical date for planting corn

Corn planting is on the forefront of farmers' minds, and with the rain, everyone is wondering when and how fast the planters will run.

The window for planting corn in northwest Kansas is from May 1 to May 20. For many people, May 15 is the magical date for getting corn in the ground. In general, the rule of thumb for yield loss is one to two bushels per day past the optimum planting window.

There is not always a yield penalty for late-planted corn. The yield is also based on many other "yield-influencing" factors. Planting date is one factor, but yield potential depends on heat or available moisture during pollination and grain fill, the timing and extent of disease, insect or weed pressure, nutrients and

stand establishment. There are benefits for stand establishment on later-planted corn. Corn emergence at 50-55 degrees Fahrenheit may take 18-21 days, while at 60-65 degrees, corn emerges in eight to 10 days. Since warmer soil temperatures results in quick emergence and a uniform stand, there is little reason to change planting rates with later-planted corn.

The best precaution for planting into wet soil is to wait until the

ground is dry enough to avoid side-wall compaction. This compaction and crusting will interfere with emergence and root growth. Some want to save time by skip-

ping the starter fertilizer at planting. Starter fertilizer shows the greatest benefits with cool soils, where germination and seedling establishment is slow. It is useful where soil tests indicate low phosphorus. Later-planted fields generally will be warmer and seedling development more rapid. Eliminating starter

fertilizer application may allow an operator to plant more acres in a day.

Finally, planting date is only one of the yield influencing factors. We are still well within the window for corn planting.

"Mudding in" a crop early to avoid planting late will almost always end up being an unwise deci-

sion," said Bob Nielson, agronomist at Purdue University.
