

# Cowboys track team takes fourth at league

The Cowboys earned three gold medals, two silver and two bronze, while the Cowgirls earned one gold, one silver and two bronze.

The Goodland boys team score was 71. Rawlins County won with 117.5, Colby was second with 94 and St. Francis third with 85. After Goodland were Hoxie with 54, Oakley with 53, Quinter with 43.5
