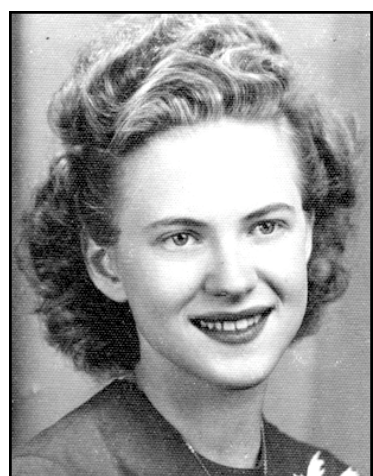
Renea Reasoner, daughter of Mark and Mary Reasoner of Goodland, will practice and perform with the state band in Hutchinson in early June.

Goodland man gives
eight gallons of blood

A Goodland man was recognized Wednesday for giving eight gallons of blood to the American Red Cross over more than three decades.

David Branda, owner of the Sherman Theatre, received his eight-gallon pin from the Red Cross when he donated blood this week. Branda said he has been donating blood about 32 years, since he was in college.

"I try to go four times a year," he

said, "but they haven't always been here that often."

The Red Cross collected 154 pints of blood in a regular drive Wednesday at the Goodland United Methodist Church fellowship hall. There were 12 first-time donors, said Curtis Duncan, president of the Sherman County Red Cross chapter. The goal was 125 usable pints, he said, and 140 of those collected can be used.

Couple's grandson goes
to math/science school

Chris Preuit, grandson of Eldon and Dorothy Palmer of Goodland, was selected to attend the West Virginia Governor's School for Mathematics and Science.

Preuit is an eighth grader at Harpers Ferry Middle School and the son of Ron and Marilyn Preuit of Harpers Ferry, W.Va.

The school is a summer residential program providing academic enrichment in the areas of science and math for students living in and attending school in West Virginia.

Only 60 eighth graders statewide will attend the two-week session at the National Radio Astronomy Observatory at Green Bank, W.Va. Students will pursue a research theme that links the

concept of the nature of science with hands-on research in radio astronomy.

They will use a 40-foot diameter radio telescope to investigate open-ended problems that are designed to cover a variety of research situations. Projects will range from measuring the hydrogen gas in the Milky Way to attempting to detect radio emission from the planets to measuring the emission from black holes in distant galaxies.

Student teams will be given free access to the telescope for observing and collecting data. Staff scientists will act as advisors to the research teams, guiding students by asking questions rather than giving answers.
