Here is another thought on thankfulness. Feeling thankful is different Ten men were cleansed, but only from giving thanks. The Bible says, 'Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18).

Did you catch that, "in all circumstances?"They key is to give thanks, not merely to feel thankful. I'm certain the nine lepers were thankful about being cleansed. How could anyone not feel thankful after being healed of a deadly disease? But only one of the ten did the right thing by

There is a tremendous difference between simply feeling gratitude and expressing gratitude.

Finally, let Jesus finish what he started in you. Look again at Jesus' final words to this man in verse 19. He said, "Rise and go, your faith has made you well." That word in the original language of the Bible means complete or whole.

Here's the result of this miracle: one man became "whole." Ninety percent of them only received a small portion of what could have been theirs, and only one received full salvation.

Jesus wants to do more than just clean you up; He wants to make you whole and complete. Why? Because a whole you will be a better you!
