

Elks K-18 team loses first games

The Goodland Elks K-18 baseball team had its first games Thursday, losing a doubleheader to Colby at Memorial Field, 21-2 and 15-3. The team is made up of 15 players age 13 to 15, with Dr. Gary Smith, veterinarian from Prairie-land Animal Clinic, coaching and Harvey DeLaRosa, a postman, and Kahle Helton, assisting. The only returning player from last year's team is Ben Waugh, a sophomore.

Colby started off in the first inning with Preston Krzycki hitting a single. The next batter, Sam Kendrick, was out by a throw to first by the pitcher. Then Brandon Rasmussen struck out. The last batter popped up to the second baseman. Shortstop Michael Pettibone lead off for Goodland. He walked but was picked off when he tried to steal second. Brook Redlin also was picked off at first. Ryan Hillmer walked, and Reed Bellamy hit a single, but Dallas DeLaRosa struck out.

In the top of the second, Colby's Jacob Hufles flied out to left. Chaz Winger made it to first on an error made by shortstop Pettibone. Jarrett Marker flied to center. The next batter, Ethan Stickle walked and scored. Brandon Gordon singled in two runs. Krzycki hit a single and Kendrick walked, as did Rasmussen, who was thrown out trying to steal second after walking. Colby led 3-0.

Laine Herl led off for Goodland with a single, and advanced on a walk, but was picked off at third. David Murray walked but was forced out at second. Garth Helton hit a single and stole second. Dillon Trachsel walked, then Pettibone struck out, leaving Goodland scoreless.

Colby made its fourth run in the top of the third. Goodland had three

up and three out.

Colby scored three runs in the fourth and Goodland had three up and three down. The score was Colby 7-0.

In the fifth, Colby scored two more runs. Goodland's Helton walked. Trachsel grounded out to the pitcher, then Pettibone and Redlin struck out. The score was Colby 9-0.

Colby scored 12 runs in the sixth inning. Goodland's Hillmer scored the team's first run by a run on a single by DeLaRosa. DeLaRosa scored the second run. The final score was Colby 21-2.

In the first inning of the second game, Colby scored five runs. Rasmussen earned an RBI and Rogers two. Goodland's Kelly Pearson hit a single and stole second but was out on a throw by the pitcher to third. Austin Avelar struck out, Hillmer was hit by a pitch and DeLaRosa struck out.

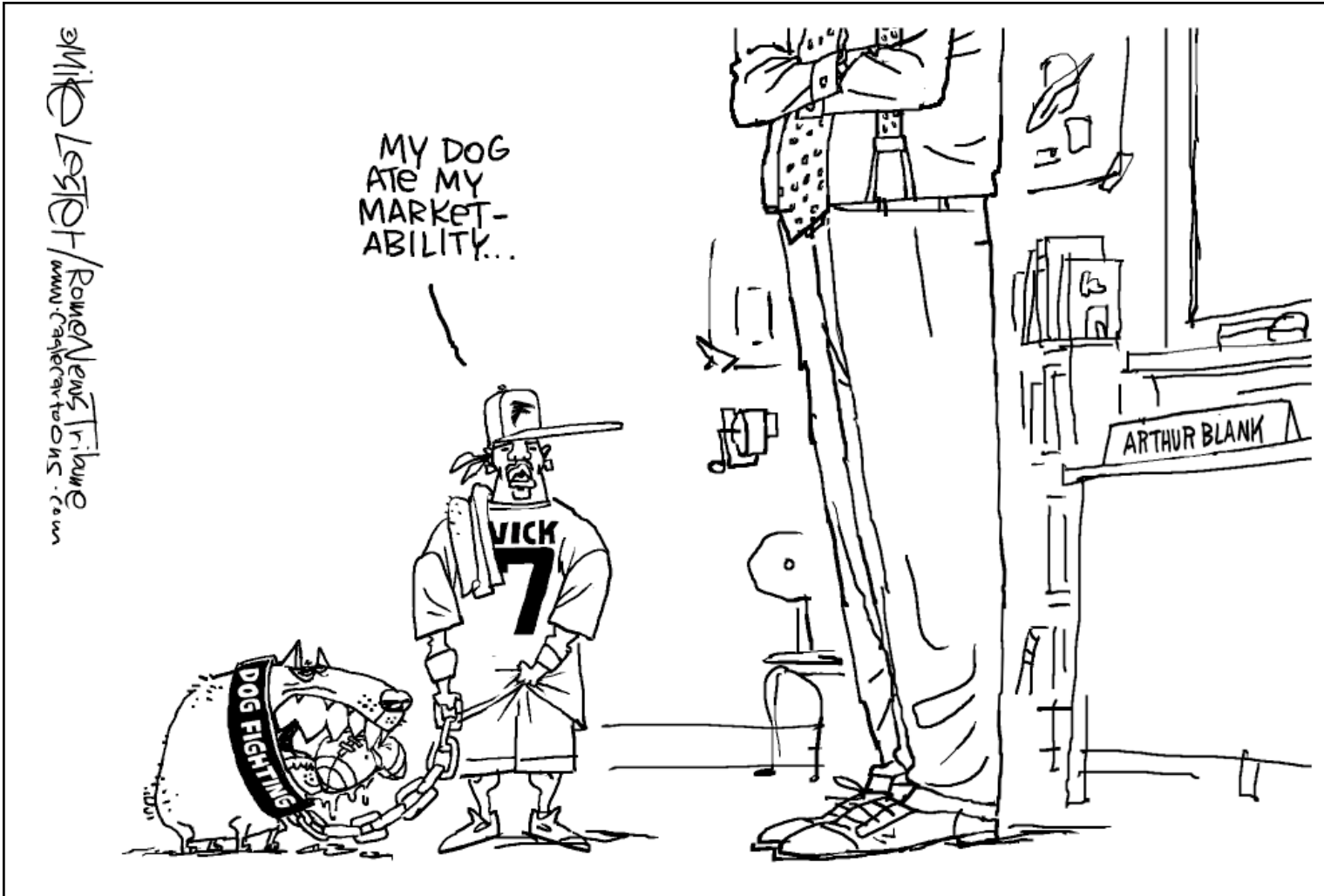
