Kanorado fire station, ambulance plans revised

ntbetz@nwkansas.com Sherman County commissioners revised plans Tuesday for an addition to the county fire station in Kanorado for a permanent home for an ambulance.

The commissioners signed a lease extension on June 5 to house the ambulance in a Kanorado city building until the addition is completed.

The commissioners had agreed to add a 20-by-50-foot bay on the south end of the Kanorado rural fire station and to get building specifications ready to go out for bid by the end of the month.


