Dale Neill, bureau board chair, said guest tax numbers look good this year, and the board hopes to raise the budget for next year to \$108,000.

He said the board had set the bureau budget for this year at \$105,000, but somehow when it was published in the county budget it was listed at \$95,000. He said that caused the bureau to republish the budget.

Neill and Bill Stoick, a board member and owner of Super 8 Motel, talked about the budget and a how the tourist season is going.

Commissioner Kevin Rasure said the county would be setting budgets in August, and if the picture is different to let the commissioners know.

Stoick said the figures for the first four months were good and the guest tax had already produced 48 percent of the estimated total for the year.
