

Four win gold medals; one medley team wins

The Goodland Swim Club won four individual gold medal at the swim meet in Wray on Saturday.

The 8-and-under mixed 100-yard medley relay team also was first. The team placed fifth with 143.5 points.

Individual event winners were Sianna Miller (8-and-under) in the 50-yard freestyle, Gerell Miller (9-10 boys) in 100-yard freestyle and 25-yard backstroke and Holton Witman (11-12 boys) won the 50-yard butterfly.
