Goodland Swim Team finishes third at league

The Goodland Swim Team held its first Northwest Kansas League Championship Meet last Friday and Saturday at Steever Water Park, placing third with members setting three pool records.

Riley Oharah (13-14 boys) was Goodland's only league champion with 29 points, tied with Jack Schwinn from Wray. He won the 50-yard freestyle in 26.96 seconds and the 100-yard breaststroke in 1 minute, 21.84 seconds and placed second in two races.

Teneille Witman (13-14 girls) won the 100-yard freestyle with a record time of 1:03.68.

Holton Witman (11-12 boys) won the 50-yard butterfly and set a record at 34.14 seconds.

The 11-12 boys 200-yard medley relay team of Holton Witman, Jed Gray, Zach Miller and Ian Bonsall set a record at 2:52.22. The 8-and-under girls 100-yard freestyle relay team of Amanda Coon, Kelsey White, Sianna Miller and Erica Hernandez also won with a time of 1:42.40.
