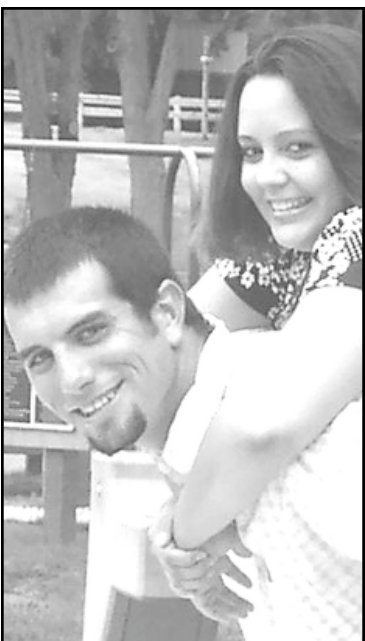
September wedding planned
