Meet set for Thursday at Sugar Hills

Junior high teams will run a combined boys and girls one-mile race at 5:40 p.m.

Schwasinger said he feels the Cowboys will be in the middle of the pack with two returning seniors, Dustin Pennington in his fourth year and Chris Geeseka in his third year; two juniors, Dallas Price and Bryan Gray, both in their second year; and Ben Waugh, a returning


