Some 30 years before, an American missionary, on his way to Japan, had paused at Shimabuku and stayed only long enough to make two converts and leave them a Japanese Bible. The new converts, with only instructions to read the Bible and live by it, began sharing their faith with neighbors.

Before long the whole town had

had been following the Bible completely.

They adopted the Ten Commandments as their legal code, the Sermon on the Mount as their guide in social conduct.

In their schools they taught the Bible, and in their courts they made decisions on what God's Word

Hall noted that they managed to create a Christian democracy at it purest. The result was there were no jails, no bars, no drunkenness, no divorce and a high level of hap-Fifteen years after the war had
