

Scholars team brings home bronze medals

The Goodland High School scholars bowl team brought home bronze medals for third place from its first meet, missing the silver by only one question.

Five members of the team attended their first meet Tuesday, Nov. 6, at Oberlin. Teams of five students compete to show who knows the most about history, math, science, literature, art, geography, current events and popular culture, said Sheryl Carson, scholars bowl coach. The event emphasizes knowledge, rapid thinking and teamwork, she said.

The Goodland team comprised Brad Geist, Brett Meissinger, Robert Borneman, Matt Espinoza and Tom Terry. They won the first round of ques-

tions after battling through six tie-breakers, Carson said. For the most part, she said, Goodland began each round with a strong presence, correctly answering the questions for world language and social science items.

Math, along with science and health, were the team's weakest areas, Carson said. Nevertheless, she said, the Goodland team tied for second place with Golden Plains. Unfortunately, because the Rexford team answered one question more than Goodland, they received the silver medals.

Goodland won third place, taking home bronze medals, she said, and that is a good beginning for a new season. The team's next meet was to be Monday at home.

Math teams finish first, third and fourth

Goodland High School teams finished first, third and fourth at the 29th annual Fort Hays Math Relays Thursday, Nov. 8.

Goodland took 10 students to compete, said Math Teacher Jackie Elliott, and there were 472 students from 14 Class 4A-6A schools, 17 Class 3A-2A schools and 17 Class 1A schools. Individuals competed against students in all divisions, she said, while team scores were based on divisions.

The freshman team of Ashley Archer, Jade Herl and Hazen Deeds won in Calculations with Calculators; the freshman team of Archer, Herl and Katlyn Toppliff tied for third in Algebraic Manipulations; the freshman team of Archer, Herl and Nathan Deeds was fourth in Number Sense; and the junior team of Devin Mangus, Brennen Clouse and Tanner Oharrah was fourth in Trigonometry.

Some of these students also competed as individuals, she said, including seniors Aaron Deeds and

Josh Doke. Math teachers at Goodland High include Elliott, Donald Raymer and Kristy Koch.

As a team, Goodland High was up against Class 4A-6A schools in Division III. Goodland finished ninth with 19 points. Salina South was first with 139, Salina Central second with 95.5, Hays High third with 75.5 and Hutchinson fourth with 72.5. They were followed by McPherson with 70.5, Buhler and Maize, each with 32, and Great Bend with 25.

After Goodland were Haven with 15, Pratt with 14, Liberal with seven, Russell with one and Smoky Valley with zero.

Scores were figured based on points compiled by contestants, both individuals and three-person teams, with nine points for each first-place finish, seven for each second place, five for each third place, three for each fourth place, two for each fifth place and one for each sixth place.
